FIRST READINGS

Public Works

260308 Sponsor: Director of Public Works Department

Authorizing condemnation and taking of private property interests for public use for Street Right Of Way purposes, for the construction, location and maintenance of the Lee's Summit Valley Garden Drive/Quarry Park Road Project, in Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri; providing for the payment of just compensation therefore; authorizing continued negotiations and purchase by the Director of the Department of Public Works; authorizing the filing of the petition for condemnation by the City Attorney on behalf of the City; and directing the City Clerk to record this ordinance in the office of the Recorder of Deeds for Jackson County, Missouri.

Sponsors: Director of Public Works

Nicolas Bosonetto and Andre Putman, Public Works, presented. This ordinance authorizes coordination with the City of Lee's Summit to repair and reconstruct damaged roadways. The damage is attributed to activities associated with a nearby quarry, and the project will require acquisition of land from the property owner. The city will compensate Mr. Putman and address additional necessary repairs and improvements to the roadway. Because the property owner did not accept the initial offer, the land acquisition will proceed through condemnation, with the courts determining appropriate compensation. The City of Lee's Summit will be responsible for all costs associated with the land acquisition, including purchase and any related fees. Estimating revenue in the amount of \$3,004,826.00 in the Capital Improvements Grant Fund; appropriating \$1,237,500.00 to the Byram's Ford Road Bridge over Round Grove Creek project; appropriating \$1,767,326.00 to the Raytown Road over Lumpkins Fork project; designating requisitioning authority; recognizing the required local grant match; and recognizing this ordinance as having an accelerated effective date.

Nicolas Bosonetto, Aaron Peak and Eric Falk, Public Works, presented. This ordinance authorizes the construction of two bridges. GO Bond funds were previously allocated; however, Public Works has secured additional grant funding to supplement the project and ensuring matching 20% funding was available the original allocation can go back into the budget for additional work. The construction of the Raytown bridge is currently in progress with the goal to complete before world cup, and construction of the Byram Bridge is scheduled to begin in late summer with completion in the fall. Authorizing the Manager of Procurement services to execute a one-year contract renewal (EVP3425) that will exceed the \$1,000,000.00 threshold with LAZ Parking, LLC to continue to provide specialized parking management services for Kansas City, Missouri parking operations, including garages, surface lots and on-street meters, enforcement and adjudication of parking tickets; authorizing the Director of Public Works to expend funds; authorizing the Manager of Procurement services to amend and extend the contract without City Council approval; and waiving the Section 2-1615(c) requirement for daily deposits.

Phillip Asante- General Services and Matt Muckethaler Public Works, presented. This ordinance requests approval to extend the existing contract for an additional five years. The Public Works Parking Division has implemented changes to improve the processing of parking collections and violations. Renewing the contract will help ensure the operational budget is sustained and that parking fees continue to be collected efficiently.

Councilmember Melissa Robinson expressed interest in expanding residential parking enforcement services, particularly within the 3rd District near 18th and Vine. According to staff, there is currently no budget allocated for enforcement outside of the downtown area; however, additional funding could be used to support expanded enforcement efforts.

Council members expressed broader concern regarding the limited parking enforcement resources outside of downtown and emphasized the need to address underserved areas throughout the city. The downtown airport's current snow blower that is over 20+ years has reached its limit. It is time for a new one and it is estimated at 1.4 million dollars for the new snow blower. The additional funds requested within budget will purchase upkeep equipment and material for both downtown and MCI airport. MCI airport does not need a new snow blower at this time, but the use is heavy at MCI and new one may be needed within this 5 years contract. ADDITIONAL BUSINESS

1. Staff from the Public Works Department will present the Annual Street Resurfacing Program.

Mark Montgomery and Garret Ross, Public Works Department, presented the Annual Street Resurfacing Program. This data driven program will select the streets, and the data is pulled into the system to determine the conditions of the road. Run scenarios based on the engineering outcomes and OCI results. This determines what roads are prioritized for repairs or updates. The results are also factors in a technique called 'micro surfacing' which is a technique the public works resurfacing team would like to bring back as an option of upkeep to the roads. This allows them to fix the level surfacing and maintain them with the specified milage under the engineering and OCI requirements. There is also a AI generated camera feature called Sam Sara that will find the issues and bring all the potholes within a week's time, eliminating a lot potholes that go unnoticed by human error.
