Executive Summary

Accepting funds allocated by the U.S. Department of Justice, Bureau of Justice Assistance, Office of Justice Programs, FY 2024 Byrne Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) in the amount of \$608,615; estimating and appropriating \$608,615 in the Justice Assistance Grant Fund; the Jackson County Prosecutor's Office (\$264,216), the City of Grandview (\$13,266), the City of Independence (\$50,214), the City of Raytown (\$13,128), and the City Kansas City (\$267,791); designating requisitioning authorities; and directing the City Clerk to file certain documents with the appropriate offices..

Discussion

The Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) supports a range of programs including law enforcement, prosecution and court programs, prevention and education programs and crime victim and witness initiatives.

Grant regulations requires that the City of Kansas City, Missouri, Jackson County, Missouri, the City of Independence, the city of Grandview and the City of Raytown, Missouri submit a joint application. All must agree on the allocation of the grant and submit a join application. The joint application specifies the award distribution to each unit of local government and the purposes for which the funds will be allocated towards. Jackson County, Missouri will service as fiscal agent for 2024 JAG.

City of Kansas city, Missouri is allocated \$608,615.

Neighborhood Services Department (NSD) will use funding 50% of one FTE in amount of \$32,449 and \$5,427 travel and office supply expenses. This position will administer the grant. NSD will provide dumpsters for neighborhood clean-ups with funding of \$15,750.

The City will provide funding in the amount of \$89,165 for inter-local partnership committee SAVE KC for client advocate case workers for Violence Prevention Program. The Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assitance Grant (JAG) program provides critical funding necessary to support a range of law enforcement and crime

prevention/intervention programming that enhances neighborhood livability.

The Kansas City Metropolitan Crime Commission (KCCRIME) will receive a total of \$125,000 in funding to support Second Change Program and the City's Adopt-A-Street Program that KCCRIME manages on the City's behalf.
