Discussion

Project Justification

The Water Services Department is undertaking this project to restore areas damaged due to water main breaks, sanitary sewer and stormwater infrastructure improvements.

Project Description

The scope of work to be provided under this contract entails repairing streets and adjacent curbs, sidewalks, driveways, yards, and other site-specific work as needed. If needed, some work may be performed to repair deteriorated areas at various Water Services Department facilities throughout Kansas City, in Cass, Clay, Jackson and Platte Counties, Missouri.

Work also includes resurfacing roads over water main replacement construction projects to bring them to new SR-1 standards, which changes the costs of restoring streets.

This contract is based on unit prices and will total \$15,000,000.00 maximum over two fiscal years for the cumulative of the original contract and proposed Renewal No. 1. Work will be performed throughout Kansas City, in Cass, Clay, Jackson, and Platte Counties, Missouri.

Haines & Associates submitted the required Evidence of Competency and Experience Reference Form/Summary for similar projects. All projects were completed within the last 5 years.

Financial Statement

A review of Haines & Associates financial standing using the Dun & Bradstreet (D&B) ratings was performed. The review indicated that Haines & Associates has a credit rating of "1R3".
