Executive Summary

Authorizing a \$590,000.00 design professional services contract with AECOM Technical Services, Inc., for the Pied Creek Wastewater Pump Station Expansion and Rehabilitation project.

Discussion

Project Justification

The Water Services Department wishes to contract with the DP to provide a watershed and pump study, which will include facility plan for the Pied Creek Wastewater Pump Station.

The Pied Creek Wastewater Pump Station, constructed in 1988, is a submersible facility at an abandoned wastewater treatment plant. There are four pump. The pump station discharges into a 20-inch force main that runs 29,570 feet, discharging at manhole NO79-253.

Due to changing conditions in the area, the wastewater pump station is approaching maximum capacity. Current permitted design flow is 3.4 MGD.

Project Description

This project will provide a watershed and pump study which will include: a facility plan, including projections of future flows and loads; current design capacity evaluation; current pump station condition; and recommendations for upgrades, repairs, and process improvements for the Pied Creek Wastewater Pump Station, which is located at 6615 Eastside Drive, Kansas City, MO 64152.

The term of this contract is 150 calendar days.

Solicitation

This project was advertised in accordance with the City's requirements. Proposals were received on August 17, 2022 with 2 consultants responding.



Awardee/Subcontracting Participation

AECOM Technical Services, Inc. was selected for this project with a contract amount of \$590,000.00, with subcontracting participation of 12% MBE and 12% WBE.

Other Proposals Received

Olsson was the only other consultant whom submitted a proposal.

Estimated Project Cost

The City's estimated cost for this project is \$590,000.00.

The 63rd Street - Woodland Avenue to Prospect Avenue reconstruction project is currently underway. WHEREAS, the City is committed to enhancing and promoting recycling and composting of solid waste; and

WHEREAS, the City has increased investment in enhancing and promoting recycling and composting options for its residents; and

WHEREAS, minority and low-income neighborhoods and communities in transition have historically been disproportionately affected by landfill uses in their communities; and

WHEREAS, recent news reports suggest that a developer may be considering applying to the City to locate a landfill in the southeastern portion of the City; and

WHEREAS, the location of a landfill at the reported site would have long-term impacts on surrounding areas and municipalities; and

WHEREAS, on March 2, 2023, the City Council passed Committee Substitute for Resolution No. 230161 directing the City Manager to perform an evaluation of the City's needs with respect to landfills and transfer stations, as well as provide alternative potential solutions; and

WHEREAS, the City Council believes that it is imperative that no permits or other zoning approvals be issued for new landfills pending this review; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KANSAS CITY:

Section 1. That the Mayor and Council hereby declare that there is a moratorium on the issuance of permits or other zoning approvals where the subject matter of the project is a proposed demolition debris landfill, solid waste separation facility or transfer station, or sanitary landfill, until June 1, 2024.
