## Safety Net Providers FY27

## Procurement Process

This ordinance seeks approval for the FY27 Safety Net Providers, authorized through a solicitation waiver. The Health Department's Office of Policy and Planning will manage the implementation of these projects.

EV4569 is a one-year contract and will be awarded to the following implementing partners:

- o Children's Mercy Hospital
- o Northland Health Care Access
- o Swope Parkway Health Center
- o Kansas City CARE Clinic
- o Samuel U. Rodgers Health Center
- o University Health

The previous five-year expenditure was \$156,721,110. The anticipated spending for the next year is \$31,494,638 which represents a reduction compared to previous years.

## Safety Net Information

The awarded suppliers will provide health care services to uninsured and underinsured residents in Kansas City, Missouri.

These contracts use Health Levy funds to enable six providers a subsidy to provide health care services to this particular population.

Services provided include general medicine, laboratory and surgical procedures, dental services, vision services, mental health services, etc.

In accordance with the requirements outlined in Ordinance No. 260026, contract reporting requirements for FY27 will transition to the Uniform Data System (UDS) standards established by the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA). Funding amounts identified for FY27 are not guaranteed for FY28, as the

# Fiscal Year 2026-27 Budget

The Fiscal Year 2026-27 budget appropriates \$31.5 million from the Health Levy Fund to support distributions to Safety Net Providers to provide healthcare services to the City's uninsured and underinsured residents.
