The possible consequences of further international spread are particularly serious considering the virulence (ability to cause serious disease or death) of the virus, the widespread transmission in communities and healthcare facilities in the currently affected countries, and the strained health systems in the currently affected and most at-risk countries. Coordinated public health actions are essential to stop and reverse the spread of Ebola including the Active Monitoring (AM) and/or Direct Active Monitoring (DAM) for travelers to ensure that, if individuals with epidemiologic risk factors become ill, they are identified as soon as possible after symptom onset so they can be rapidly isolated and evaluated. Active monitoring should consist of, at a minimum, daily reporting of measured temperatures and symptoms consistent with Ebola (including severe headache, fatigue, muscle pain, weakness, diarrhea, vomiting, abdominal pain, or unexplained hemorrhage) by the individual to the public health authority. For direct active monitoring, a public health authority directly observes the individual at least once daily to review symptom status and monitor temperature; a second follow-up per day may be conducted by telephone in lieu of a second direct observation.
