Boundaries:


West: Indiana Avenue

Green infrastructure opportunities generally along wooded corridor west of Norton Avenue and north of 38th Street



 KC Water used an Adaptive Management process available in Consent Decree to assess the feasibility and performance of an alternative green infrastructure solution in lieu of a relief sewer solution to reduce sewer overflows

KC Water

- EPA approved the green infrastructure solution which will provide greater combined sewer overflow reduction and other community benefits
- KC Water will use a programmatic approach to facilitate collaboration between City
 Departments and leverage our collective talents and resources to improve public
 infrastructure and help revitalize this neighborhood
