## **RESOLUTION NO. 240453**

Recognizing May 13-17, 2024, as "National Police Week" in Kansas City, Missouri.

WHEREAS, National Police Week honors and remembers law enforcement officers who have made the ultimate sacrifice by giving their lives in service to others while in the line of duty, as well as those who continue to serve with courage righteousness; and

WHEREAS, each year, over 150 law enforcement officers lose their lives in the line of duty, and in 1962, President John F. Kennedy signed a proclamation that designated May 15th as Peace Officers Memorial Day and the week in which that date falls as Police Week. President Bill Clinton directed that the flag of the United States be displayed at half-staff on all government buildings on May 15th each year to honor these lives lost; and

WHEREAS, the Missouri Law Enforcement Memorial, which holds annual memorial services at the beginning of May, is dedicated to all the law enforcement heroes, past, present, and future, and their family members, who all are dedicated to serving and protecting the citizens and visitors of Missouri; and
