A1 – Workforce

- 25 total positions are funded through the workforce component:
 - Health Education
 - Disease Investigation
 - Financial Services
 - Program Evaluation
 - Data Modernization
 - Workforce Development
 - Infant/maternal care
 - Community Health Work
- \$6,664,782 to be drawn over five years
(Dec 1, 2022-Nov 30, 2027)

A2 – Foundational Capabilities

A2 Budget Period 4 (A2-BP4) has a total allocation of \$739,567 and will be used for efforts in the following strategies:

- 1) Continuance of the Community Wellness Ambassador program (Year 4)
- 2) Priority travel for conferences and professional development (Year 2)
- 3) Online platform for public health training and continuing education (Year 4)
- 4) EHR System Needs Assessment and Scoping
- 5) Community Health Improvement Plan (CHIP) Implementation
- 6) Strategic Marketing
