WHEREAS, the STP is identified as Federal Project No. STP-3377(408); and

WHEREAS, Council adopted Ordinance 200624 authorizing the Director of Public Works to execute the STP Supplemental Agreement with MHTC; and

WHEREAS, MHTC has agreed to provide an additional \$4,239,287.00 for a total reimbursement expenditure not to exceed \$7,239.287.00 through STP Supplemental Agreement #2; and

WHEREAS, City Council approved Ordinance 240132 which authorized a design professional Servies Amendment No. 6 with Alfred Benesch & Company for a total contract amount of \$2.271.326.00; and

WHEREAS, amendment No. 7 is needed to compensate the designer for updating the plans to the current city standards, utility coordination, and final design requirements to meet the federal plan standards; NOW THEREFORE,

 - The Front St. Project has been in the design and ROW process for many years. The initial study to improve Front St. included a public mtg. in Nov. 2010 at the Metropolitan Community College. Design work proceeded afterwards and resulting in plans completed in 2018 with a public mtg. with the NE Industrial Assoc. in April 2019. The COVID epidemic stalled the project in 2020 and ROW work began afterwards with Public Works reaching out to the following industries and businesses along Front St.- Evergy, Mars Petcare, Heinson Enterprises, Midwest Terminal Warehouse, HAK Inc., KR Real Estate, Karbank Properties, and CPKC Railroad. ROW acquisitions and easements were obtained for all properties by 2024 and plans were finalized in 2023 after lengthy delays caused by the condemnation process. Additional funding was obtained in 2023 and 2024 to fund the project.

It provides for a long term durable pavement surface for Front St. requiring little maintenance; it provides a long term solution to storm water mgt. including reduced impact on combined sewer and reducing peak flows from high precipitation events; it provides for energy efficient street lights; it provides for improved traffic flow and safer routes for all types of traffic mobility.

Executive Summary

Accepting the recommendations of the Health Sciences Community Improvement District Advisory Committee and adopting the housing improvements funds program.

Discussion

This resolution will accept the recommendations of the Health Sciences CID Advisory Committee regarding the use of Redirected EATS for the CID's Housing Improvements Funds Program. This resolution would not direct additional funds to the CID. The EATS are already being redirected. This would simply accept the recommendations as to the use of the redirected EATS.

The existing cooperative agreement between the Health Sciences CID and the City redirects EATS to the CID. The cooperative agreement established a CID Advisory Committee which is made up of two City Councilmembers and multiple adjacent neighborhood representatives. In order to use the Redirected EATS, the Advisory Committee must make recommendations to the City Council and CID Board of Directors which need to be adopted by said bodies. Per the agreement, not less than 30% of the Redirected EATS shall go to the Housing Improvements, and the Infrastructure Improvements will receive up to 70% of the Redirected EATS. The agreement states the Housing Improvements Funds Program will be (a) investment in residential housing related improvements that directly improve health and quality of life within the Benefit District; and (b) other Programs agreed upon by the City and the Health Sciences CID.

The Advisory Committee is proposing to use \$53,263 of the Redirected EATS for two initial projects for the Housing Improvements Funds Program. The program will work with the KCMO Health Department and Children's Mercy Hospital on two residential homes in the CID Benefit District. These homes are owner occupied, have children living in the home under age 6 and the occupants meet income qualifications at 92% and 80% of median income according to HUD Income Guidelines. Proposed housing improvements are related to lead paint hazards, cleaning duct work, installing smoke

and carbon monoxide detectors and ventilation work. Both projects are supported by EPA and HUD guidelines for healthy homes.

Once the projects of this proposed program are completed, the CID and its Advisory Committee will be required to make further recommendations to the City Council for the future of its program and respective projects.
