University of KS Hospital Authority - Medical Case Management	

<b>Reason</b>
Increase agreement with the University of KS to provide Ryan White Part A Medical Case Management services for persons living within the eleven county Kansas City, Missouri Transitional Grant Area .

**Details**

<p><b>Reason for Legislation</b></p> <p>To provide <b>Ryan White Part A Medical Case Management</b> services for persons living within the eleven county Kansas City, Missouri Transitional Grant Area (KC-TGA). This Grant Award Agreement of <b>\$409,509.00</b> is funded through the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services Health Resources and Services Administration (hereinafter "HRSA" or "Grantor"), Ryan White HIV Emergency Relief grant #H89HA00028, Part A, and enables KCHD and its local community Partner University of KS Hospital Authority to provide HIV Medical Case Management services for persons living with HIV/AIDS. This grant is effective from March 1, 2020 to February 28, 2021.</p>
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<p><b>Discussion</b> (explain all financial aspects of the proposed legislation, including future implications, any direct/indirect costs, specific account numbers, ordinance references, and budget page numbers.)</p> <p>The purpose of this funding is to Provide Ryan White Medical Case Management services on behalf of the City of Kansas City, Missouri. This funding will help ensure that all residents living with HIV/AIDS within the 11 county Kansas City Transitional Grant Area (KC-TGA) have access to medical care and support services. To provide culturally sensitive Medical Case Management services for persons living with HIV/AIDS.</p> <p>Ryan White Medical Case Management services are a range of client-centered services that link clients with health care, psychosocial, and other services. Activities will include (1) identifying and screening clients; (2) Assessing each client's medical and psychological history and current service needs; (3) Developing and regularly updating a service plan based upon the client's needs and choices; (4) Implementing the plan in a timely manner; (5) providing information, referrals, and assistance with linkages to medical and Psychosocial services as needed; (6) Monitoring the efficacy and quality of services through periodic reevaluation; (7) Advocating on behalf of clients to decrease services gaps and remove barriers to services and (8) Helping clients develop and utilize independent living skills and strategies.</p>

**Details**

Ryan White funding is appropriated annually by Congress. The awards for Part A are split into formula and supplemental funds. Formula funds are awarded based on the number of new cases of HIV/AIDS in the funded service area. Supplemental funds are awarded based on demonstrated need and quality of local plans in the annual application. The KC-TGA has received Part A Ryan White funding for 26 years.

University of KS Hospital Authority is one of five sub-recipients who provides Ryan White Part A services on behalf of The City.

**This funding will contribute to a sustainable Kansas City because** quality health care directly impacts the economic vitality, social and environmental quality of a community. Promoting and protecting citizens of Kansas City is the goal of all public health programs. Individuals living with HIV/AIDS are required to enroll in Medical Case Management to receive access to Ryan White Part A core medical & support services. Funding for health insurance and primary care services ensures that residents living with HIV/AIDS, within the KC TGA, receive appropriate health care services and treatment of their disease through federal and local funding.
