We live at 2400 Forest Ave in Beacon Hill.

We purchased our home because of the small community atmosphere. We also felt like it was a safe area (but it is not with loose dogs).

We have witnessed several occasions of large pit bull dogs running loose.

The first time was when we were on vacation and our house sitter sent us pictures of two dogs running loose up by the mailboxes by the park. He immediately grabbed up our tiny Shihtzu and went back to our house.

We've had numerous issues with the pitbull's, and the homeless people right behind the La Quinta hotel. It took months to get those cleared out of there. The police even got involved, and told my husband that the homeless were not ready to surrender their dog so they couldn't take them! Ridiculous!

We live across from that field in the green home on the corner.

Someone is not doing their job in policing this area and keeping it safe. I also know of a neighbor and a dog that were actually bitten by these loose dogs running around. I refuse to walk out of my own fenced backyard. We even bought bear spray, which was suggested by another neighbor, to use in the event we got attacked. We are sick of these dogs running loose.
