Executive Summary

Sponsor: Director of Public Works

Estimating revenues in the amount of \$880,000 in the Capital Improvements Grant Fund; appropriating that amount to the Citywide Safe Roads and Streets for All - Planning Study project; authorizing the expenditure of already appropriated match funds; designating requisitioning authority and directing the City Clerk to file certain documents with the appropriate offices.

Discussion

This ordinance would accept \$880,000 from the USDOT for the grant program of Safe Roads and Streets for All. This funding is designated to be used as supplemental action planning money which would help advance policy and planning tasks outlined in the Vision Zero Action Plan. The tasks associated with this grant are to do a comprehensive speed limit review, update the major street plan, and update public works standards with a vision zero focus.

This grant would help us to create a complete streets design guide, identify new standards for setting speed limits which would priroritize safety, and update the major street plan to properly identify future corridors.

Prior Legislation

Resolution 220660 adopted the Vision Zero Action Plan and supported the City applying for this grant. It noted the City's support of providing a 20% match and identifying funds to move the action plan forward. The Complete Streets Ordinance 170949 calls on the City to create a safe and connected multimodal network for the safety and health of all users. Vision Zero Ordinance 200019 calls on the City to reduce and eliminate traffic deaths. Ordaince 230613 passed a Pedestrian, Cyclist, and Vehicular safety plan which solidifies the City's intent to make our roads safer.

Service Level Impacts

This would help City Planning and Development, Parks Department, and Public Works to be more efficient and clear in what we are looking for regarding safe roads and streets. This would create a comprehensive complete streets design guide for both internal staff and external clients to rely on.

Other Impacts

 This would impact the health of all residents with making our streets safer and slowing speeds and incorporating a complete streets design guide.
