

Executive Summary

Accepting \$12,000,0000 Grant from the United Stated Department of Agriculture's IRA Urban and Community Forestry Grant program. The purpose of this grant is to increase the density of Kansas City's Urban Tree Canopy through a collaborative effort by the Neighborhood Services Department, the Office of Environmental Quality, and the Parks and Recreation Department.

Discussion

The Kansas City Urban Tree Canopy Program is designed to reduce the impact of climate change in environmental justice communities by improving the tree canopy in climate vulnerable communities. Improving the tree canopy will provide more equitable access to urban tree canopy and associated human health, environmental and economic (workforce) benefits in climate vulnerable communities.

The primary project partner for The Kansas City Urban Tree Canopy Program is Bridging The Gap (BTG), a non-profit organization that has partnered with the City for over twenty years. BTG's Heartland Tree Alliance program has planted and maintained over 35,000 trees since 2002, targeting areas where tree canopy is lacking. BTG will carry out the educational and neighborhood engagement activities of this project in partnership with the City's Office of Environmental Quality (OEQ). For this project, Heartland Tree Alliance program will oversee all planting, both under their organization and any additional contractors, if needed, in conjunction with any planting activity, staff will go door-to-door, engaging with the community about the tree planting and educating them around the importance of trees and tree care. Our other community partner, Kansas City Community Gardens (KCCG) currently supports 90 urban orchards located within disadvantaged neighborhoods in Kansas City, Missouri identified by the CJEST. These orchards include 1,529 fruit and nut trees and 437 brambles. Combined these orchards have the capacity to provide 363,672 pounds of fruit (over 1 million servings) on an annual basis, over a productive lifetime of 30+ years. KCCG staff train and provide ongoing support to two or more volunteers from each neighborhood to serve as orchard stewards, who take the lead on orchard care and harvest distribution. Led by the stewards, neighbors design, plant, prune, harvest, and distribute food from their orchard. The orchards are designed to be within walking distance of food insecure residents, removing the transportation barrier to receiving free, healthy food the orchards provide. For this project, KCCG will create new orchards in willing neighborhoods within the CJEST-identified areas. They, along with the OEQ's Natural Systems Coordinator will recruit and provide training for orchard stewards, along with providing holistic care supplies.

The Kansas City Urban Tree Canopy Program will:

- Complete a Tree Master Plan for climate vulnerable communities within Kansas City;
- Increase equitable access to the urban tree canopy coverage through an aggressive infrastructure building, planting, and maintenance program;
- Broaden public awareness and engagement through public education and outreach will focus on the importance of the tree canopy, including preservation and maintenance techniques.

All grant program activity will be overseen by the Parks and Recreation Department, and the Neighborhood Services Department will serve as the fiscal agent for the grant funding.

The Kansas City Urban Tree Canopy Program will target areas identified as climate vulnerable communities in the Kansas City Climate Protection & Resiliency Plan. The Climate Protection & Resiliency Plan planning process defined climate vulnerable communities, in its Climate Risk and Vulnerability Assessment, as areas with the highest energy burden, exposure to extreme heat, likelihood of experiencing disproportionate impacts during times of extreme heat and during flooding events, and includes areas with a high percentage of people:

- Living below 200% of the poverty line
- Over the age of 65
- Without access to a vehicle
- With a disability
- In a home built prior to 1960

COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE

Calling an election on April 8, 2025, for the purpose of renewing a one-quarter cent capital improvement – public safety sales tax for 15 years; setting forth the ballot language to be used; directing the City Clerk to provide notice of election; amending Chapter 68, Article VII, Code of Ordinances by enacting a new Section 68-447.5 contingent upon voter approval; directing the City Clerk to provide notice to the Director of Revenue if the sales tax question is passed by the voters; declaring the intent of the City Council to maintain the currently imposed capital improvement – public safety sales tax through its current expiration of June 30, 2026; and recognizing this ordinance as having an accelerated effective date.

WHEREAS, in an election held on November 2, 2010, the qualified voters of the City previously approved the extension of a sales tax authorized by Section 94.577, RSMo., to expire on June 30, 2026; and

WHEREAS, The City Council hereby declares its intent to maintain the currently imposed sales tax in Code of Ordinances Section 68-447 through June 30, 2026, and, that if approved by the voters, the tax described in Section 5 shall be imposed in accordance with that section thereafter; NOW THEREFORE

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KANSAS CITY:

Section 1. That an election is called on April 8, 2025 for the purpose of submitting to the qualified voters of Kansas City, Missouri the question of renewing a capital improvement sales tax authorized by Section 94.577, Revised Statutes of Missouri.

Section 2. The ballot title for the sales tax proposition shall be:

QUESTION ___ SHALL THE FOLLOWING BE APPROVED?

Shall the City of Kansas City, Missouri continue to impose a sales tax authorized by Section 94.577 of the Revised Statutes of Missouri for a period of 15 years at a rate of 1/4% to be used for the construction, operation, and maintenance of capital

improvements, including capital improvements related to public safety purposes, and which may include the retirement of debt under previously authorized indebtedness or to repay bonds not yet issued?

This sales tax would continue the existing sales tax authorized by Section 94.577 of the Revised Statutes of Missouri and scheduled to expire on June 30, 2026.

Section 3. The Notice of Election shall read as follows:

Section 4. That following the passage of this ordinance, the City Clerk shall deliver certified copies of this ordinance and notice of election to the Clerk of Cass County, Board of Election Commissioners of Clay County, Board of Election Commissioners of Kansas City, and Board of Election Commissioners of Platte County, not later than January 28, 2025, which shall be the authority of each election authority of the City to submit the amendment to the electors of Kansas City and to give public notice as provided by law.

Section 5. That upon voter approval of the ballot question described in Sections 2 and 3 of this Ordinance, Code of Ordinances Chapter 68, Article VII, entitled "Sales Taxes," shall be amended by enacting a new section 68-477.5 to read as follows:

Sec 68-447.5. Imposition of tax (Public Safety 2026)

Pursuant to the authority granted by and subject to the provisions of Section 94.577, RSMo., a tax for the benefit of the city is hereby imposed upon all sellers for the privilege of engaging in the business of selling tangible personal property or rendering taxable services at retail to the extent and in the manner provided in Sections 144.010–144.525, RSMo., and the rules and regulations of the director of revenue issued pursuant thereto. The rate of tax shall be 1/4 percent on the receipts from the sale at retail of all tangible personal property or taxable services at retail within the city, if such property and such services are subject to taxation by the

state under the provisions of Sections 144.010–144.525, RSMo. The tax shall become effective on July 1, 2026 for a period of fifteen (15) years and shall apply to all sales made after June 30, 2026, and shall be collected as provided in Section 94.577, RSMo.

Section 6. If approved by the voters, the City Clerk shall, within ten (10) days after the approval, forward to the Missouri Director of Revenue by United States registered or certified mail, a certified copy of this ordinance together with certifications of the election returns accompanied by a map of the City clearly showing its boundaries.

Section 7. The City Council hereby declares its intent to maintain the currently imposed sales tax in Code of Ordinances Section 68-447 through June 30, 2026, and, that if approved by the voters, the tax described in Section 5 shall be imposed in accordance with that section thereafter.

Section 8. That this ordinance, calling for an election and providing for the submission of a proposal to the people of Kansas City, Missouri, is hereby recognized as an ordinance with an accelerated effective date within the meaning of Section 503(a)(3)(A) of the Charter, and as such shall become effective immediately following approval by the Mayor or five days after passage if no action is taken by the Mayor to approve or veto the ordinance.

Executive Summary

Calling an election on November 5, 2024, for the purpose of renewing a one-quarter cent capital improvement - public safety sales tax for 32 years; setting forth the ballot language to be used; directing the City Clerk to provide notice of election; amending Chapter 68, Article VII, Code of Ordinances by repealing existing Section 68-447 and enacting in lieu thereof a section of like number and subject matter contingent upon voter approval; directing the City Clerk to provide notice to the Director of Revenue if the sales tax question is passed by the voters; declaring the intent of the City Council to maintain the currently imposed capital improvement - public safety sales tax should the sales tax question not be approved by the voters; and recognizing this ordinance as having an accelerated effective date.

Discussion

In an election held on November 2, 2010, the qualified voters of the City previously approved the extension of a sales tax authorized by Section 94.577, RSMo., to expire on June 30, 2026. A new election will be held November 5, 2024 for qualified voters of the City to determine renewal.

RESOLUTION - Adopting the 2024 Update of the Citywide Business Plan with the latest Five-Year Planning Models; directing the City Manager to include assumptions of the 2024 Update in the FY 2025-26 Submitted Budget; and directing the City Manager to align departmental strategic plans and business plans to the Citywide Business Plan.

WHEREAS, the City Council adopted Resolution No. 120879 on October 11, 2012, stating the Council's intent to adopt a long-term financial plan and to review and update it on an annual basis; and

WHEREAS, the City Council adopted Resolution No. 130025 adopting the City's strategic plan of priorities and performance indicators; and

WHEREAS, the residents of Kansas City at the April 8, 2014, Special Election amended the City Charter in Section 804 to mandate the adoption of a Five-Year Financial Plan by November 1 of each year; and

WHEREAS, since enactment of this Charter provision, the City Council has adopted a resolution approving a Citywide Business Plan including Council Goals, the Financial Strategic Plan, and the Five-Year Planning Model; and

WHEREAS, the City Council adopted Resolution No. 230893 on October 26, 2023, adopting the 2025-2029 Citywide Business Plan; and

WHEREAS, the Submitted 2024 Update to the Citywide Business Plan contains the proposed Five-Year Planning models; and

WHEREAS, the City Goals include Finance and Governance, Housing and Healthy Communities, Inclusive Growth and Development, Public Safety, and Infrastructure and Accessibility, with 25 total Objectives and 122 Strategies; and

WHEREAS, the Financial Strategic Plan proposes 7 financial objectives; and

WHEREAS, the Submitted 2024 Update of the Citywide Business Plan proposes a Five-Year Planning Model that addresses several objectives in the Financial Strategic Plan; NOW, THEREFORE.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF KANSAS CITY:

Section 1. That the City Council hereby adopts the Five-Year Planning Model that addresses objectives identified in this resolution and that includes the following assumptions:

- Assume FY 2024-25 Adopted Budget plus the following conditions:
 - Assumes annual wage increases in each year of the five-year financial plan at 4.0%; Local 42 assumes passed CBA pursuant to Ordinance No. 240725 with average increases in FY25 of 14.76%; FY26-28 2.0%; and FY29 5.0%
 - Assumes pension required contribution increases of 5.0%; Pension adjustments in FY27 adding an additional 5.0% contribution for Local 42 for compensation adjustments
 - o Assumes healthcare increases in each year at 5.0%
 - Assumes contractual services and commodity increases in each year at 2.8%, based on the regional consumer price index
 - The General Fund subsidizes anticipated shortfalls in other governmental activities funds (Special Revenue, Debt, Capital)
 - o Assumes the following scenarios in the General Fund:
 - Refinance debt starting in FY 2027
 - Assumes the following mandates in the General Fund required by Resolution or Ordinance:
 - Increase cost of wages pursuant to L42 Ordinance No. 240725
 - Assumes General Fund will need to support Public Safety Sales Tax Fund recurring costs starting June 30, 2026
 - ERP System replacement citywide with charges to various funds based on number of users
 - Fleet replacement based on current inventory lifecycle and condition
 - Fire Department required position additions of 21 floating Firefighter/Paramedic positions pursuant to grievance result
 - Fire Department vacancy rate adjustment from 7.0% to 3.0%

Section 4. That the City Council directs the City Manager to include the assumptions of the Five-Year Planning Model, GOKC Bond Plans (2017 and 2022 authorizations) and Capital Improvements Sales Tax Plan in the Submitted FY 2025-26 Budget.

Section 5. That the City Council directs the City Manager to facilitate strategic and business planning of City departments and to align departmental strategic plans and business plans to the Citywide Business Plan.

Executive Summary

Adopting the 2024 Update of the Citywide Business Plan with the latest Five-Year Planning Models; directing the City Manager to include assumptions of the 2024 Update in the FY 2025-26 Submitted Budget; and directing the City Manager to align departmental strategic plans and business plans to the Citywide Business Plan.

Discussion

In April 2014, the residents of Kansas city approved a change in the City Charter requiring the production of the Financial Strategic Plan and the Five-Year Planning Model every year. Most significantly, the Charter change marked an important first step in breaking a pattern of successive single-year fixes, often implemented without a long-term view. This Citywide Business Plan consists of three components:

- The City's Strategic Plan, including the mission, vision, values, goals, objectives, and strategies
- The Financial Strategic Plan, containing financial objectives
- The Five-Year Planning Model, providing the baseline and balanced scenarios to evaluate financial and operation alternatives through the planning and budgeting process

The City's Strategic Plan is a four-year document designed to align with City Council terms.

The 2024 Citywide Business Plan has five goals, 25 objectives, and 122 strategies. The structure of the Citywide Business Plan allows for out-year planning while remaining responsive to change with annual updates. The City's Finance Department regularly uses the Five-Year Planning Model to project fiscal health with rapidly evolving assumptions, and the Strategic Plan guides financial decision-making. The Citywide Business Plan plays an ever more critical role in decision-making as the City navigates financial and operational challenges. The City will continue to evaluate the

success of the Plan in a changing environment, report on that progress, and adapt to any future challenges as they arise.

The 2024 Update includes the following:

- Updates to the GOKC Bond Plans (2017 and 2022 issuances) and Capital Improvements Sales Tax Plan in the Submitted FY 2025-26 Budget.
- A Five-Year Planning Model that addresses objectives identified in this resolution and that includes the following:
