Data Deficiencies of BIPOC Businesses in KC

Addressing the lack of quality data of BIPOC businesses by building a database of business owners by size, sector and resource needs. This deficiency of information on BIPOC businesses consistently undermines business owners as they seek to advocate for additional resources, support, and contract opportunities.

Entrepreneurial Support Organizations



Entrepreneur support organizations (ESOs) experience many of the same challenges faced by Kansas City's diverse small business community that stifle their effectiveness. This includes staffing and resource constraints, lack of business education and practical experience, and fragmented systems of support. Without addressing these structural and systemic constraints, enabling equitable and inclusive small business growth will remain an unattainable goal.

Resource Partner Enhancement Program residency to strategically advance the capabilities and capacity of 3–5 BIPOC led entrepreneurial support organizations. Capital support in the form of grants will be provided to the resident organizations to implement new programming and/or advance their existing programming with new staff and technology.

AREAS OF RESOURCE IMPACT:

- **Informal Entrepreneurship** support for new businesses
- **Access to Capital** technical assistance to accessing capital for a business
- **Contracting and Certification prep** through Inclusive Procurement technical support and programs
- **Back-Office Support** to help businesses sustain and grow (i.e. legal, accounting/bookkeeping, marketing, HR, etc.)
