WHEREAS, the following four companies will be awarded a contract under the Green Infrastructure Maintenance Program for Year 1: 1) Common Nature, 2) DuPree Landscaping & Lawn Care LLC, 3) Lotus Lawncare & Services LLC, and 4) Snoop's Lawn Mowing LLC; NOW, THEREFORE,

#### BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KANSAS CITY:

Section 1. That the Director of the Water Services Department is authorized to execute the Green Infrastructure Maintenance Program Facility Repair and Maintenance contracts for Pre-Qualified Contractors, Project No. 60820062. A copy of these contracts are on file in the office of Water Services.

Section 2. That the Director of the Water Services Department is authorized to expend up to \$1,100,000.00 from Account No. 25-8110-801320-B, Engineering Overflow, to satisfy the cost of these contracts.

Section 3. That the Director of the Water Services Department is hereby authorized to execute four successive one-year renewal options for these contracts without additional Council approval with such funds as appropriated by the Council in future annual budgets, for a maximum expenditure of \$5,500,000.

### **Executive Summary**

Authorizing an expenditure of \$1,100,000.00 for Facility Repair and Maintenance contracts during Year 1 (FY25) of the Green Infrastructure Maintenance Program; authorizing four successive one-year renewals for Facility Repair and Maintenance contracts without further City Council approval; authorizing a maximum expenditure of \$5,500,000.00; and recognizing this ordinance as having an accelerated effective date.

### **Discussion**

#### Reason for Contract

In 2010, the City of Kansas City, Missouri entered into a Consent Decree with the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) to reduce the volume and frequency of overflows from the City's sewer system. The City's Smart Sewer Program is currently in year 14 of a 30-year implementation period. The purpose of this program is to provide regular maintenance for green infrastructure sites across the City to preserve function, aesthetics, and to maintain compliance with the Nine Minimum Controls requirements of the Consent Decree.

#### Facility Repair and Maintenance Contract Description

The scope of work to be provided under the Facility Repair and Maintenance Contracts is for routine maintenance of specified green infrastructure sites including but not limited to trash, sediment and debris removal, weed and pest control, and vegetative pruning and edge control. Nine sites are included in Year 1, with the intent of adding additional sites in subsequent years. Long-term maintenance of green infrastructure assets currently in design and/or construction will be maintained under this Green Infrastructure Maintenance Program to supplement existing KC Water green infrastructure maintenance resources. The total amount for Green Infrastructure Facility Repair and Maintenance Contracts is \$5,500,000.00 that covers year 1 and four additional years.

The term of this program will be 365 calendar days with four 365-day renewals. <u>Solicitation</u>

The Green Maintenance Program was advertised in accordance with the City's requirements on September 21, 2023, with qualifications being received on October 24, 2023. There were five (5) contractors that submitted qualifications.

#### Awardee/Subcontracting Participation

The following four companies will be awarded a contract under the Green Infrastructure Maintenance Program: 1) Common Nature, 2) DuPree Landscaping & Lawn Care LLC, 3) Lotus Lawncare & Services LLC, and 4) Snoop's Lawn Mowing LLC.

#### Other Bidders/Subcontracting Participation

Eyedeal Lawn Care Solutions also submitted their qualifications and has been prequalified for award of contracts by City in the future. Because Eyedeal Lawn Care Solutions is currently providing green infrastructure maintenance services under an existing contract, they will not be awarded a contract in the first year of the Green Infrastructure Maintenance Program.

#### MBE/WBE Goals

KC Water will use a programmatic approach to achieve the M/WBE goals established for the Green Maintenance Program whereby KC Water will be responsible for contracting the maintenance of specific green infrastructure sites directly with prequalified M/WBE contractors. CREO established 23% MBE and 0% WBE goals on the project on July 10, 2024.

At the commencement of this Green Infrastructure Maintenance Program in 2024, the M/WBE goals for this program will be 23% MBE and 0% WBE based on the number of prequalified M/WBE contractors in the program. M/WBE goals for this program will be reviewed jointly by CREO and KC Water leadership on an annual basis and adjusted as needed based on the actual number of prequalified M/WBE firms participating in the Green Maintenance Program.

## **Executive Summary**

#### **Discussion**

#### **Project Justification**

The City of Kansas City, Missouri is in the process of eliminating areas where public sanitary sewers are not available to its residents.

One of the areas requiring the City's immediate attention is the residential neighborhood in and around 55th Street and Bennington Avenue. Sampling in the area shows higher than acceptable E. coli bacteria related to human waste. This is a potential health risk to the residents. While considered in the former Sewer District 719 and located just to the west Blue Parkway, the area survives primarily on septic tanks with no access to public sanitary sewer.

In response to the problem, the City has split Sewer District 719 into smaller districts. These are now Sewer Districts 11040, 11041, and 11042 along with a smaller Sewer District 719. Sewer District 11042, where the sampling has taken place, is the worst area of the neighborhood and will receive the most attention first. Connections to proposed sanitary sewer system for existing houses in this district will be available, while main extensions will be extended to the other three districts.

In 2007, Taliaferro & Browne, Inc. prepared sewer construction plans for Sewer District 11042. In 2013, the plans were updated with the addition of a 40' line across

Cambridge Avenue. The current project calls for updating the Sewer Plans as prepared in 2013.

#### **Design Summary/Project Description**

The City Council passed Ordinance No. 110252 on April 14, 2011 approving a \$54,994.00 Design Professional Services contract with Taliaferro & Browne Inc.as well as assessing properties benefitted for a special assessment.

The contract provided for the final design and construction phase services for new gravity sanitary sewer joint district and collection systems to serve existing residential areas in the vicinity of 55th and Bennington Avenue, which were designated as Sewer Districts No. 11040, 11041, 11042, and 719.

The City Council passed Ordinance No. 220063 on January 27, 2022 for a \$135,803.00 design professional services contract Amendment No. 1 for updated design drawings for current site conditions on this project.

The City executed a no-cost design professional services Amendment No. 2 to this project on December 8, 2022 which updated the engineering job classifications and salary rates on the project.

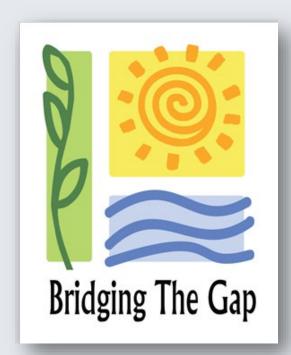

Authorizing the Manager of Procurement Services to execute a \$1,000,000.00 professional, specialized or technical services contract with the Mid America Assistance Coalition, for the Low Income Assistance Program for a one-year term; approving three successive one-year renewal options with further Council approval; and recognizing this ordinance as having an accelerated effective date.

### **Discussion**

### Project Justification/Project Description

The City Council established the Water Services Utility Funding Task Force in 2016 to integrate community values into a funding strategy for its water, wastewater, and stormwater utilities.

The Water Services Utility Funding Task Force recommended increasing the amount of customer assistance to benefit eligible low-income households to help pay their water, wastewater, and stormwater utility bills.

The Water Services Department (WSD) desires to continue a public assistance program to aid low-income residents in payment of their water bills. WSD wants to contract with one umbrella social service agency, which then coordinates assistance with the other local social services agencies.

The Mid America Assistance Coalition (MAAC), a not-for-profit corporation, is the coordinating agency for emergency assistance organizations and homeless services providers in the Kansas City area. WSD sets the eligibility criteria and then sends payments to MAAC. Through MAAC, local social service agencies will be able to access a database and tap into the funds when a client meets the eligibility criteria. The social service agency will then write the check to WSD on behalf of the client.

MAAC has distributed utility funds to Kansas City area agencies since 1982, and currently provides this assistance service for Evergy, formerly known as KCP & L and others. MAAC uses MAACLink, a centralized computer database system to fund and

track performance of area agencies and the distribution of financial resources. Currently, their system links funding sources through more than fifty (50) agencies in the local service area. Through this program, they are able to meet our reporting requirements for all monies provided.

### <u>Term</u>

The term of this project will be 365 days for the initial contract. This contract will also have three successive one-year renewal options with further City Council approval. The amount of funding for future contracts will be determined at that time, subject to the availability and appropriation of funds in future annual budgets.

### Solicitation

A solicitation waiver was approved by the City Manager on May 1, 2024 pursuant to Code of Ordinances 3-3(d)(3) and 3-7(2)(d). There is only one source for this service.

### **Discussion**

#### **Project Justification**

This project entails printing and mailing of bills for water services and other consumer correspondence using the KWIC (Kansas City Water Information Center) billing software

#### **Project Description**

Each business day the contractor receives an electronically delivered file containing the current day's bills for water services, delinquent and turn off notices and other consumer correspondence. The contractor generates the bills for water services, provides the envelopes and letter stock which are used to print and mail out consumers' water bills and letters. The contractor sorts the mail to achieve the best possible postal rates and sends the mail to the United States Postal Service each business day. Additionally, this contract promotes customer E-bills to reduce paper usage and postage.

This project affects residents, commercial, and wholesale customers in Kansas City, Missouri, and wholesale customers outside of Kansas City, Missouri.

## **Executive Summary**

Authorizing a \$3,623,000.00 Design Professional Services contract with Black & Veatch Corporation for the In-Line Storage: Additional OK Creek Storage Facilities project; and recognizing this ordinance as having an accelerated effective date.

#### **Discussion**

#### Reason for Contract

In 2010, the City of Kansas City, Missouri entered into a Consent Decree with the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) to reduce the volume and frequency of overflows from the City's sewer system. The City's Smart Sewer Program is currently in year 14 of a 30-year implementation period.

The purpose of this project is to evaluate the feasibility and effectiveness of constructing additional in-line storage facilities along the OK Creek combined sewer at two locations. The intent of these facilities is to reduce combined sewer overflows and protect public health and the environment.

#### **Contract Description**

The scope of work to be provided under the contract includes completion of a conceptual study to select specific locations and types of two in-line storage facilities within the OK Creek Interceptor (OKCI) upstream of the existing OK Creek In-line Gate Structure, Rock Box and Turkey Creek Pump Station. Upon selection of the specific gate locations and types the Design Professional will proceed with preliminary and final design services and bid phase services.

The intent of the additional storage facilities is to reduce combined sewer overflows (CSOs) at outfall W005 within the Turkey Creek Basin. The initial planning study for the gates feasibility and benefit are outlined in the May 2023 Memorandum entitled "Turkey Creek In-line Storage Hydraulic Evaluation" completed by the Smart Sewer Program System Planning Team.

As a result of the CSO reduction potential outlined in the memorandum, the City is contracting with the design professional to provide the necessary professional

engineering services for feasibility evaluation and Concept Design, with Preliminary Design, Final Design and Bid Phase services to be completed subsequently if sites are determined to be viable

#### <u>Term</u>

The term of this project will be 365 calendar days to complete the conceptual study. The prelimninary and final design durations will be agreed upon following the completion of conceptual study.

#### Solicitation

The In-Line Storage: Additional OK Creek Storage Facilities project was advertised in accordance with the City's requirements on November 9, 2023, and proposals were received on December 22, 2023, with one (1) proposal received.

Non-discrimination in Employment. Contractor shall not discriminate against any employee or candidate for employment on the basis of an individual's race, hair texture or hair style associated with an individual's race, color, sex, religion, national origin, or ancestry, disability, sexual orientation, gender identity, age, or in any other manner prohibited by Chapter 38 of the City Code. Contractor shall not engage in any discrimination as prohibited by Chapter 3 of the City Code.

#### Ban the Box in Hiring and Promotion.

- (a) Pursuant to Section 38-104, City Code Ordinances, Contractor shall not base a hiring or promotional decision on an applicant's criminal history or sentence related thereto, unless the employer can demonstrate that the employment-related decision was based on all information available including consideration of the frequency, recentness and severity of a criminal record and that the record was reasonably related to the duties and responsibilities of the position.

If, and only if, Subcontractor does not possess a current certificate of compliance, Contractor shall obtain a copy of the Subcontractor's affirmative action program and tender a copy of the same, in print or electronic format, to CREO within thirty (30) days from the date the subcontract is executed.

City has the right to take action as directed by City's Civil Rights and Equal Opportunity Department to enforce this provision. This is a material term of this Contract.

<u>Compliance with Laws.</u> Contractor shall comply with all federal, state and local laws, ordinances and regulations applicable to the work and this Agreement. Contractor shall maintain in effect all the licenses, permissions, authorizations, consents and permits that it needs to carry out its obligations under this Agreement.

<u>Prevailing Wage.</u> If the Agreement exceeds \$75,000.00 and any of the Services performed by Contractor includes construction, reconstruction, improvement, enlargement, alteration, painting and decorating, or major repair, that is subject to the Missouri Prevailing Wage Law (Section 290.210, RSMo – 290.340, RSMo), Contractor shall immediately notify the City prior to performing Services so the parties can execute an agreement that incorporates, the appropriate Wage Order. Contractor shall comply with all requirements of Section 290.210, RSMo – 290.340, RSMo even if Contractor fails to notify the City.
