

CERTIFICATE OF SUFFICIENCY

Your initiative petition *did* receive a Certificate of Sufficiency.

You reported 3,776 valid signatures, which are above the required 2,068, meaning the petition meets the legal threshold for sufficiency.

What that means

A *Certificate of Sufficiency* is issued when election authorities verify that a petition has collected at least the minimum number of valid signatures required by law. Once issued, the petition is eligible to move forward in the initiative process.

- Outcome: Sufficient — the petition qualifies.
