- KCPS has over 40 languages spoken within its school buildings and nearly a quarter of our students are English Language Learners
- KCPS serves the highest population of refugee students in the state of Missouri
- KCPS serves more Special Education students than most other school districts and charter schools in the city and state of Missouri
- KCPS serves students who sang at Carnegie Hall last year
- In 2022, KCPS graduates were accepted to Ivy League Schools and received full tuition scholarships to local colleges and universities

#### WHERE DO THEY LIVE?

- KCPS boundaries include the 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> Council Districts
- Eviction rates within KCPS boundaries are more than double the eviction rates of other Kansas City school district boundaries — some KCPS schools have mobility rates as high as 60 percent
- Several of the zip codes within KCPS boundaries have some of the highest rates of violent crime in the City
- Currently, most of our students live east of Troost whereas more than 90 percent of abated dollars within our boundaries have gone to support development projects west of Troost

#### WHERE DO THEY ATTEND SCHOOL?

- KCPS serves students in signature schools and neighborhood schools
- KCPS is home to the #2 high school in the state of Missouri
- KCPS provides trauma-informed therapeutic services, reading interventionists, and parent liaisons
- KCPS has more than 300 million in deferred building maintenance
- KCPS has not passed a voter-approved GO Bond since the 1960s and therefore does not have dedicated capital dollars

# WHAT IS BLUEPRINT 2030?

## Blueprint 2030 is a plan to increase academic achievement and enhance the student experience

It is the vision for education in Kansas City with 2025 and 2030 goals. It will serve as the update to the current KCPS Strategic Plan.

Blueprint 2030 will be continuously monitored and updated after the first 5 years to ensure we are on track to achieve the vision.

- Expansion of non-traditional school options (personalization of educational experiences)
- Equitable offerings and opportunities for all schools (world language, fine arts, etc.)

- Build "Grow Your Own" teacher pipeline
- Expand professional learning offerings to address key areas of need. (i.e. reading, ESOL, math, special education strategies/endorsements)
