Brief Title	Approval Deadline
Reappropriating \$491,000.00 from the Jackson County COVID19 Fund into the designated accounts	

Reason
Due to the pandemic and it's impact on schools Parks and Recreation has entered into an agreement with Kansas City Public Schools to offer virtual learning sites for essential workers

Details
Reason for Legislation Reappropriating \$491,000.00 from the Jackson County COVID19 Fund into the designated accounts; designating requisitioning authority; directing the expenditure of funds by April 30, 2021; and recognizing this ordinance as having an accelerated effective date.
Discussion <p>Parks and Recreation, working with Kansas City Public Schools, will offer virtual learning sites at the following community centers: Gregg Klice, Southeast, Brush Creek , Garrison, Tony Aguirre, Westport Roanoke, and Hillcrest.</p> <p>Classes will be held from 8:30am - 3:30pm Monday through Friday. Trained instructors assist students with their virtual learning curriculum. Extended day option will be available. In addition to teaching materials, parent manuals will also be provided. Meals and transportation are provided by KCPS. Optional extended day program is available as well.</p> <p>Parks will enter into two contracts with Boys & Girls Club of Greater Kansas City and Camp Fire Heartland to provide DESE accredited instructors to provide instructional assistance</p> <p>This is free to all KCPS students. KCPS has agreed to reimburse the City \$100/month/student. Non-KCPS families will pay a fee of \$80/student/week.</p> <p>This is a new program offering from KC Parks. The department does not normally offer programming of this sort throughout the school year. Due to the pandemic and the restrictions on in-person classes, the department feels this service is vital for families with essential workers.</p>
