As a proponent of downtown Kansas City, we at the Kansas City Marriott Downtown urge the City Council to support <u>Ordinance No. 201080</u>, to continue the progress made on the Barney Allis Redevelopment project.

Along with many businesses anchored downtown, The Kansas City Marriott Downtown is an active investor in Kansas City and has been for 34 years. Now, more than ever, we encourage the City to continue to invest in their own success and prioritize the Barney Allis Redevelopment project - even during these challenging times.

Tourism is an extremely important part of the Kansas City economy which tourism supports 48,000 jobs in our community. We are a convention hotel that hosts 220,000 visitors each year.
