Executive Summary

Estimating revenue in the amount of \$550,000.00 in the Capital Improvements Sales Tax Fund and appropriating that amount for the Hodge Park Improvements project to the same fund.

Discussion

On August 24, 2017, the City Council, passed Ordinance No. 170590 estimating \$3,400,000.00 in the Capital Improvements Sales Tax Fund and appropriating that amount to the Hodge Park Improvements for infrastructure improvements within the park that include concrete trail construction, playground construction, multipurpose field construction, parking lot improvements and general park improvements. On October 1st, 2020, the City Council, passed Ordinance No. 200776 estimating \$900,000 in the Capital Improvements Sales Tax Fund and appropriating that amount to the Hodge Park Improvements to provide water for restroom facilities and fire suppression. The TIF Commission approved an additional \$550,000 for the design and installation of sports lighting for the multi-purpose fields at the Hodge Park.
