I am writing to express my deep concerns over the potential negative economic impact on local businesses due to the loss of 300 parking spots in the River Market area due to the City Harvest Project. As you may know, parking is already an issue in the area, and the loss of so many spots could have a devastating effect on small businesses that rely on foot traffic.
