## **Executive Summary**

Adopting and authorizing the execution of amendments to the 2021-2024 Collective Bargaining Agreement with Local No. 42, I.A.F.F. and to the 2021-2025 Collective Bargaining Agreement with Local No. 3808, I.A.F.F. and adopting side letter agreements to make such amendments that will increase retiree health insurance subsidy contributions by current members of the Firefighters' Pension System and by the City; waiving limitations established by the Fund Balance and Reserve Policy in section 2-1954 of the Code of Ordinances; appropriating \$1,602,000.00 from the Unappropriated Fund Balance of the General Fund to increase the retiree health insurance subsidy contribution from the City to four percent from two percent; and recognizing this ordinance as having an accelerated effective date.

## **Discussion**

This legislation adopts the side letter agreements for Local No. 42 and Local No. 3808, increasing the city contributions to the retiree health subsidy from two percent to four percent. and appropriates Unappropriated Fund Balance in the General Fund in the amount of \$1.6 million.
