Executive Summary

Authorizing a \$3,824,431.00 construction contract with Kissick Construction Company, Inc., for the Inflow and Infiltration (I/I) Reduction: Birmingham 3 project; authorizing a maximum expenditure of \$4,207,000.00; authorizing a \$560,000.00 design professional services Amendment No. 1 to Contract No. 1509 with Olsson Associates, Inc., for the I/I Reduction: Birmingham 3 project for a total contract amount of \$1,310,00.00; and recognizing this ordinance as having an accelerated effective date.

Discussion

Reason for Contract

In 2010, the City of Kansas City, Missouri entered into a Consent Decree with the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) to reduce the volume and frequency of overflows from the City's sewer system. The City's Smart Sewer Program is currently in year 14 of a 30-year implementation period. The purpose of this project is to reduce inflow and infiltration (I/I) flows in the sanitary sewer system. System information was gathered to identify and quantify I/I sources and to develop rehabilitation and I/I source reduction recommendations. Activities will include various sewer rehabilitation methods to reduce I/I and to restore the service life of existing sewers in the project area.

Construction Contract Description

The scope of work to be provided under the construction contract includes approximately 1,390 lineal feet of replacement 8–inch diameter sanitary sewer, rehabilitation of 10,710 lineal feet of existing sanitary sewer from 8-inches to 21-inches in diameter, and rehabilitation of 256 manholes. The total amount of the proposed construction contract is \$3,824,431.00.

The term of this project will be 510 calendar days.

Construction Project MBE/WBE Goals

CREO KC established goals of 10% MBE and 10% WBE on the construction project on June 12, 2023 as part of the CREO KC Annual Goal Program.

Solicitation

The I/I Reduction: Birmingham 3 project was advertised in accordance with the City's requirements on October 19, 2023, and bids were opened on November 14, 2023, with two (2) bidders responding.

Awardee/Subcontracting Participation

Kissick Construction Company, Inc. submitted the lowest, most responsible, and most responsive bid of \$3,824,431.00, with subcontracting participation of 11% MBE and 10% WBE.

Other Bidders/Subcontracting Participation

The Havens Construction Company, Inc. was the next lowest bidder on this project. They submitted a bid in the amount of \$4,163,155.00, with subcontracting participation of 10% MBE and 10% WBE.

Estimated Opinion of Probable Construction Costs

The Engineer's Opinion of Probable Construction Cost was \$4,088,149.00.

Design Professional Services Contract Amendment Description

City Council passed Ordinance No. 190199 on March 21, 2019, which authorized a \$750,000.00 design professional services contract with Olsson Associates, Inc. for the I/I Reduction: Birmingham 3 project.

The proposed Amendment No. 1 in the amount of \$560,000.00 will provide for construction phase services including project management and administration services, construction office and field support services, and resident project representative services and will increase the total contract amount to \$1,310,000.00.

Prior Legislation

City Council passed Ordinance No. 190199 on March 21, 2019, which authorized a \$750,000.00 design professional services contract with Olsson Associates, Inc. for the I/I Reduction: Birmingham 3 project.

Service Level Impacts

This inflow and infiltration reduction project will reduce the amount of stormwater and groundwater getting into the City's separate sanitary system by repairing sewer pipe structural defects and help restore sewer conveyance capacity and reduce the occurrence of wet-weather overflows within the City's existing sanitary sewer system, thereby protecting public health and the environment.

Other Impacts

 The project will protect public health and the environment by reducing the volume of inflow and infiltration into the existing system, increasing the service life of the existing sewer system, and increasing the water quality of the City's waterways.
