# Bill of Rights for the Unhoused Update/Discussion

- Conversation with CW Parks-Shaw on how to move forward
- Still waiting on Legal to okay the bill language
- Right to Shelter during extreme weather conditions
  - o Situation where certain shelters discriminate against LGBTQ+ community
  - Blowback on the city if theoretically they use city funds to promote shelters that discriminate against the LGBTQ+ Community
  - o Action: Forward these concerns to the LGBTQ Commission

# Legislative Updates

- Ordinance 210055: Healthy Homes
  - o Was supposed to be addressed October 20th, 2021 but was held in committee once again
- Ordinance 210445: Pallet Community Funding
  - o Likely to resurface in late October 2021 under a new ordinance name
- Health In All Policies (HiAP)
  - o Analyst in the City Manager's office will focus on health in all policies framework
  - Resolution 210480- adopted on 6/10/2021 directing the City Manager to work with all the Director of Health and Health Commission Co-Chairs to develop a plan to create the Health in All Policies framework and for City Manager's office to present that plan within 45 days
  - o Emily has incorporated everyone's feedback and is working out the final pieces
  - o Action: Connect Emily to the Data KC Analysist tasked with implementing HiAP
- Ordinance 210873
  - o Discussion on changing the timeframe from 20 years to 99 years
  - o Discussion on including a community advisory board with tenants leading that board
  - o Discussion on changing the 60%AMI to around 30%AMI
  - Motion: Send a Letter to Health Policy and Advocacy and/or the Health Commission with amended policy goals. Samuel De Jong motioned. Janis Deveney Seconded. Motion Unanimously Passed.
- Marijuana & Housing Legislation
  - o In the wake of revenue loss from the pandemic, recreational marijuana might be on the table
  - o Earmark \$25 million dollars for Affordable Housing- potentially more sustainable revenue stream
