 - Reviewed workshops scheduled on the infill ordinance
- Housing
 - Work on short-term rentals will be in this committee
- Infrastructure, to include Public Improvements Advisory Committee (PIAC)
- Neighborhood information management (registration platform)
- Branding

Upon motion duly made and seconded, the 6 recommended committees will be established.

Neighborhood Services report

Gary Jones, Community Engagement Coordinator, shared an update on activities within Neighborhood Services, including efforts to increase funding and support for registration, organization and structural documents, and other activities.

The proposed neighborhood registration platform is being reviewed by IT as part of the procurement process.

The City's social media team will be encouraged to interact with the KCNAC social media to increase activity and connections between the accounts.
