ORDINANCE NO. 220860

Sponsor: Mayor Quinton Lucas

Accepting a \$25,000.00 Award from the U.S. Conference of Mayors Climate Challenge in recognition of the City's zero fair zero emissions transit initiative; and estimating that amount as revenue and appropriating that \$25,000.00.

WHEREAS, climate change, which is projected to rapidly increase the City's average temperatures over the next several decades is one of the most pressing issues facing Kansas City; and

WHEREAS, trees can cool the city by as much as ten degrees on a given day, thereby reducing air conditioning bills and possibly saving lives as well as absorbing rainfall and air pollution and contribute dozens of others benefits ranging from reduced crime to increased real estate values to measurable improvements in the happiness and pulmonary health of our citizens; and

WHEREAS, each year, through their Climate Protection Award Program, the United States Conference of Mayors (UCSM) recognizes and honors mayors for outstanding and innovative practices that increase energy efficiency, expand renewable energy, and/or reduce carbon emissions; and

WHEREAS, Mayor Lucas and the City of Kansas City were awarded the first-place prize of \$25,000.00 in the 2022 USCM Climate Protection Awards for implementing a Zero-Fare Public Transportation program; and

WHEREAS, the award funds will be used to combat the urban heat island effect by increasing and maintaining tree canopy coverage across Kansas City, with a focus on communities that have been disproportionately impacted by climate change and are underserved by current tree coverage; and

WHEREAS, investments in preserving and expanding our urban tree canopy are key strategies named in both the City's Urban Forestry Master Plan and the City's Climate Protection & Resiliency Plan; and

WHEREAS, urban trees are a critical asset to our community, improving quality of life and mitigating climate change by sequestering carbon, reducing energy usage, removing air pollutants, filtering stormwater and cooling hot city streets by providing shade; and WHEREAS, tree canopy coverage, and the associated benefits, are not spread evenly in all communities; and

WHEREAS, increased tree planting, with a focus on areas underserved by current tree coverage, can combat the urban heat island effect and mitigate the effects of increased temperatures from climate change; NOW, THEREFORE,

ORDINANCE NO. 220864

Sponsor: Director of General Services

Declaring certain real property generally located at 1200 and 1210 Broadway, Kansas City, Missouri, surplus to the City's needs; authorizing the Director of General Services to offer the sale of the City's interest in this real property in accordance with City regulations, and execute related documents to complete the transfer of the real property while reserving easements, as necessary, for any existing City owned sewer, storm water, and water line infrastructure on the said property.

WHEREAS, all City departments have been notified and this property is not needed by the City and no interest has been expressed in retaining the land for future public use; and

WHEREAS, the City owns rights in certain real property generally located at 1200 and 1210 Broadway, Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri; and

WHEREAS, all existing easements, right of way, and/or any other encumbrances affecting the real property, shall remain in effect as set forth in the Quitclaim Deed executed as a part of the subsequent transfer; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KANSAS CITY:

Section 1. That the parcels described below, are hereby declared surplus to the City's needs.

Section 2. That the Director of General Services Department is hereby authorized to currently offer for sale in accord with City regulations, and make available through an open and public competition, with such conditions determined appropriate by the Director of General Services, the City's rights in the property located at 1200 and 1210 Broadway, Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri, legally described as follows:

TRACT 1: Lots 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5, Block 1, Broadway Addition, a subdivision in Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri, according to the recorded plat thereof.

TRACT 2: All that part of Block 1, Lykins Place addition, a subdivision and part of 5 foot strip "left for alley" in Broadway Addition, a subdivision 'all in Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri, described as follows: Beginning at a point in the south line of 12th Street, as now established, 155 feet west of the northeast corner

of Lot 1, Block 1, of said Broadway Addition; thence south 127 feet 10 inches; thence east 35 feet to the east line of said strip "left for alley"; thence north along said east line 127 feet 10 inches to the south line of said 12th Street; thence west along said south line to the point of beginning.

TRACT 4: The south 10.75 feet of Lot 7, Lot 8, and the north 7.75 feet of Lot 9, Block 1, Broadway Addition, a subdivision in Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri; also that part of Lot 10, Aldine Place, a subdivision of land, that part of Block 1, Lykins Place addition to the City of Kansas, a subdivision in Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri, and that part of a 5 foot strip of land lying west of and adjacent to the west line of said Block 1, Broadway Addition, all being more particularly described as follows: Beginning at a point that is 120 feet west of a point located 7.5 feet south of the southeast comer of Lot 8 of Block 1 of Broadway Addition, thence west 60 feet to the west line of said Lot 10, Aldine Place; thence north with the west line of said Lot 10, Aldine Place, to the north line of said Lot 1 0; thence east with the north line of said Lot 10, Aldine Place, to the west line of Block 1 of Lykins Place Addition; thence north with the west line of Block 1 of Lykins Place Addition, to a point located on the said west line of Block 1 of Lykins Place Addition, located 164 feet 4 inches south of the south line of 12th Street, as now established; thence east to a point on the west line of said Lot 7, Block 1, Broadway Addition which is 10. 7 5 feet north of the southwest comer of said Lt 7, Block 1, Broadway Addition; thence south to the point of beginning.

TRACT 5: Lot 9, except the north 7.75 feet thereof, and all of Lots 10 through 13, inclusive, Block 1, Broadway Addition to Kansas City (hereinafter referred to and more commonly known as Broadway Addition), a subdivision in Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri, according to the recorded plat thereof; also, all that part of Lot 10, Aldine Place, a subdivision in Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri, according to the recorded plat thereof, which lies south of the westerly projection of a line lying 7.5 feet south of and parallel to the north line of said Lot 9, Block 1, Broadway Addition; also, all that part of the 5 foot wide strip of land "left for alley" in said Broadway Addition, and all that part of Block 1, Lykins Place Addition, a subdivision in Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri, according to the recorded plat thereof, which lie north of the westerly projection of the south line of said Lot 11, Block 1 Broadway Addition, and east of the east

line of said Lot 10, Aldine Place, and south of the westerly projection of a line lying 7.75 feet south of, and parallel to, the north line of said Lot 9, Block 1, Broadway Addition, and west of the west line, projected north and south, of Lot 10, Block 1 of said Broadway Addition

Collectively, the Tracts 1-5, are referred to as "Property."

Subject to building lines, easements, reservation, restrictions, covenants and conditions of record.

Further subject to any and all other existing easements, right of way, and/or any other encumbrances, recorded or non-recorded, affecting the real property, and also subject to a reservation of easements, as necessary, for City owned sewer, storm water, and/or water line infrastructure located on the said property and existing on or before the execution of this Special Warranty Deed or Quitclaim Deed as necessary.

Section 3. That the Director of General Services is hereby authorized to execute any real estate or other documents needed to effectuate this transaction.

ORDINANCE NO. 220776

Amending Chapter 2, Code of Ordinances, by enacting Section 2-886, dispensing with the requirement that certain improvements erected or to be erected upon land belonging to the City be approved by the Municipal Art Commission.

WHEREAS, Section 1137 of the City Charter provides that the City Council may dispense of the requirement that arches, bridges, structures and approaches which are the property of any corporation or individual and which extend upon any street, avenue, highway, park or property belonging to the City be approved by the Municipal Art Commission; and

WHEREAS, the Municipal Art Commission is charged with additional powers and duties as the principal advisory arm of the city in matters of design and visual elements of major public buildings, structures, and art objects and in matters of promoting, fostering and encouraging cultural activities of all kinds, including the fine arts and performing arts; and

WHEREAS, the Municipal Art Commission wishes that the Council dispense with the Commission's approval of certain structures encroaching upon City property so that the Commission may focus its attention on those powers and duties stated above; and

WHEREAS, the City Planning Department, pursuant to Section 18-25 of the City's Code, is delegated with the authority to review and approve encroachments onto City property;

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KANSAS CITY:

Section 1. That Chapter 2, Code of Ordinances of the City of Kansas City, Missouri, is hereby amended by enacting Section 2-886, to read as follows:

Sec. 2-886. Commercial Encroachments.

Notwithstanding any other provision of this division, and pursuant to Section 1137(b) of the City Charter, projecting signs with a face area not exceeding twelve square feet, awnings, balconies, fire escapes, retaining walls, patios, accessibility ramps, and any doors which shall extend upon any street, avenue, highway, park or property belonging to the City shall not be subject to the approval of the Municipal Art Commission.

Legislation Text

ORDINANCE NO. 220809

Approving and authorizing the City Manager to enter into a master agreement with the Missouri Highways and Transportation Commission, The Lamar Company, L.L.C., and TLC Properties, Inc. for the grant of permanent easements on City properties located in the vicinity of I-70 and Highway 40 for the public purpose of facilitating the construction of the Buck O'Neil Bridge replacement project; and authorizing City Manager to execute easement documents.

WHEREAS, the City of Kansas City, Missouri ("City") and Missouri Highways and Transportation Commission ("MHTC") entered into a Cost Apportionment Agreement, as authorized by Committee Substitute for Ordinance No. 200222, effective May 1, 2020; and

WHEREAS, City and MHTC were each responsible for fifty-percent of the cost of rightof-way acquisition for the Buck O'Neil Bridge replacement project ("Project"), including any cost overruns or underruns; and

WHEREAS, MHTC filed a condemnation action on 2 August, 2021, *State of Missouri ex rel. MHTC v TLC Properties, Inc., et al.*, Case No. 2116-CV16421, against TLC Properties Inc. and The Lamar Company, L.L.C., to acquire property interests necessary for the Project which included an easement and double-sided outdoor advertising sign with a tri-vision sign on one side; and

WHEREAS, the Condemnation Commissioners' Award for TLC Properties, Inc. and The Lamar Company, L.L.C. was \$850,000, and MHTC, TLC Properties, Inc., and The Lamar Company, L.L.C. all filed exceptions to the Commissioners' Award and requested a jury trial to determine the value of the property interests;

WHEREAS, the City owns a parcel of property located at 6411 E US 40 Hwy ("Access Property") and an adjacent parcel to the south ("Sign Property") on which The Lamar Company, L.L.C. currently operates an outdoor advertising sign ("Sign");

WHEREAS, under the terms of the Master Agreement, TLC Properties, Inc. and The Lamar Company, L.L.C. shall forego and/or return the Commissioners' Award, less attorney's fees and costs not to exceed \$75,000, which shall be deposited back into the Project fund accounts;

WHEREAS, the Council finds that granting a permanent easement for the location of the Sign and a permanent access easement under the terms of the Master Agreement is for the public purpose of reallocation of the Commissioners' Award for other Project improvements,

distribution of fifty percent of any excess Project funds to the City, eliminating costs and risks of litigation and reducing City's exposure to cost overruns, and facilitating the expedient completion of the Project; and

WHEREAS, The Lamar Company, L.L.C. has met the requirements of Municipal Code § 88-445-14.5(j), and may convert the Sign to back-to-back digital signs and said back-to-back digital signs may exceed the digital sign cap under § 88-445-14.5(m).

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KANSAS CITY:

Section 1. That the City Manager is authorized to enter into a Master Agreement with the Missouri Highways and Transportation Commission, The Lamar Company, L.L.C., and TLC Properties, Inc. for the conveyance of permanent easements on City property located in the vicinity of I-70 and Highway 40 for the public purpose of facilitating the construction of the Buck O'Neil Bridge replacement project.

Section 2. That the City Manager is authorized to execute permanent easement documents set forth in the Master Agreement.
