WHEREAS, the City has multiple vibrant and diverse residential and commercial districts reflecting the City's history and employment centers; and

WHEREAS, a uniform system of wayfinding creates a clear and accessible means for residents and visitors alike to navigate easily between destinations including but not limited to: neighborhoods, districts, key landmarks, destinations, community parking and;

WHEREAS, the City is multi-modal and accommodates the needs of drivers, bikers, and pedestrians, and:

WHEREAS, the City hosts numerous sport and convention events drawing visitors from across the globe; and

WHEREAS, as part of the City's tourism and convention efforts, the City wants visitors to experience all of Kansas City's destination districts and make it easier for all to explore and enjoy the City; and

WHEREAS, a uniform wayfinding system would provide a better, simpler residents and visitor experience and

WHEREAS, the City has successfully utilized standardized wayfinding downtown and desires to replicate that success citywide; NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KANSAS CITY:

Section 1. That Chapter 62, Article XII of the Code of Ordinances is hereby amended by repealing Section 70-952, entitled "Manual and specifications for traffic control devices" and enacting in lieu thereof a new section of like number and subject matter, to read as follows:

Sec. 70-952. Manual and specifications for traffic control devices.

All traffic control and wayfinding signs, signals and devices shall adhere to and be consistent with design standards housed within the Kansas City Department of Public Works. Such standards shall conform to the manual and specifications approved by the Federal Highway Administration. All signs and signals required under this article for a particular purpose shall be uniform as to type and location throughout the city. All traffic control devices so erected and not inconsistent with the provisions of state law or this chapter shall be official traffic control devices.

WHEREAS, Kansas City desires to make improvements to North Platte Purchase including improving traffic signals, roadway, drainage structures, sidewalks, streetlights, a trail under North Platte Purchase, and the bridge over Route 152; and

WHEREAS, relinquishment of the ownership and maintenance of a portion of North Platte Purchase to the City from MHTC will assist in making the improvements to North Platte Purchase, NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF KANSAS CITY:

Section 1. That the City Manager is hereby directed to request from MHTC the relinquishment of a section of North Platte Purchase and ancillary property interests to the City for the purpose of improving North Platte Purchase.

Section 2. That the Director of Public Works is authorized to enter into a Road Relinquishment Agreement for the purpose of transferring ownership and maintenance of a certain portion of North Platte Purchase – and ancillary property interests - from MHTC to the City. Discussion

The Twin Creeks commercial development proposed for the corner of Tiffany Spring and Platte Purchase requires an intersection improvement and permitted driveway on a section of roadway currently under the jurisdiction of MoDOT. MoDOT will not allow a full-access driveway due to traffic concerns regarding the newly constructed diverging diamond interchanges (DDI) at Rt. 152. The only path for the developer to obtain driveway access is for KCMO to obtain jurisdiction of N. Platte Purchase from approximately 350-ft south of Tiffany Springs to NW 88th Street.

WHEREAS, on August 10, 2017, the Council expressed support in a data-driven systematic sidewalk program to prioritize sidewalk inspections and repairs through Committee Substitute for Resolution 170516; and

WHEREAS, on June 20, 2019, the Council approved Ordinance No. 190476, a design services contract with Bartlett & West in the amount of \$540,100.00 for the project; and

WHEREAS, on October 15, 2020, the Council approved an amendment Ordinance No. 200851, a design services contract with Bartlett & West in the amount of \$199,854.00 for the project; and

WHEREAS, on October 28, 2021, the Council approved an amendment Ordinance No. 210930, a design services contract with Bartlett & West in the amount of \$199,800.00 for the project; NOW THEREFORE,

WHEREAS, on July 16, 2020, the Council passed Ordinance No. 200550 which approved an amendment to a previously approved MPD Plan on approximately 80 acres in an area generally bordered by the Missouri river on the north and west, I-29 on the east, and railroad tracks on the south, for the purpose of amending the MPD plan to allow for a hotel, site layout modification, and increase in square footage and building height within the mixed use development in multiple phases on 13 parcels; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 200550 incorporated all of the conditions of approval of Ordinance No. 140583 passed by the Council on July 31, 2014; and

WHEREAS, Condition 20 in Ordinance No. 140583 required that prior to each phase after Phase 1, the developer submit a traffic study update to the Public Works Department for review and approval, and that the developer construct any improvements as required by the Public Works Department based on the approved updated traffic study for each phase; and

WHEREAS, the Council desires to amend Ordinance No. 200550 to provide that the developer may continue to receive building permits and construct the KC Current Stadium, but that the public improvements recommended by the traffic impact study must be completed before a final Certificate of Occupancy is issued, NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KANSAS CITY:

Section 1. That Section A.1. of Ordinance 200550 is hereby repealed and a new section enacted in its place, to read as follows:

Conditions of approval of Ordinance No. 140583 passed by the City Council on July 31, 2014, still apply and shall be carried forward, with the exception of Condition 20 in Ordinance No. 140583, which shall be amended as follows: That prior to each phase after Phase 1, the developer submit a traffic study update to the Public Works Department for review and approval using specific detailed land uses, and that the developer construct any improvements as required by the Public Works Department based on the approved updated traffic impact study for each phase. KC Current stadium may continue to receive building permits and construct the stadium, but the Temporary Certificate of Occupancy may not be issued until the traffic impact study has been completed and approved, and that all required public improvements recommended by the study have been constructed and accepted by the issuing entity or written approval by issuing entity has been received
