SAAB will provide the following in support of the virtual ramp control systems:

- professional staff to manage aircraft ground traffic in and out of the MCI single terminal ramps, gates, the Remain Over Night parking locations and deicing operations in corrdination with FAA tower control and aircraft pilots. Professional staff will manage aircraft traffic utilizing the VRC system and tools provided by Saab. Staffing shall include coverage from 0400 to 2400, 7 days a week, 365 days a
- Aerobahn Surface Management software (SMAN), licensing and hosting, plus user support and customer service support 24x7x365.
- preventative and corrective maintenance of the system. This includes maintenance of the hardware replacement/repair and support, software and program support and infrastructure needed for a fully operational system.

It is recommended that in accordance with Code Section 3-3, the solicitation requirements of Section D number 5 be waived and that approval be granted to enter into a new contract with Saab Inc. to provide operation and maintenance service of virtual ramp control systems in the new terminal facility at Kansas City International Airport. The estimated amount of this contract will be eight million one hundred seven-nine thousand two hundred fifty-eight dollars (\$8,179,258) to be paid by the Aviation Department.

The factors supporting this recommendation are as follows:

- 1. It is in the best interest of the City to utilize the original manufacturer of City owned virtual ramp control systems for all maintenance and repair. During the new terminal planning process, Saab Inc. was awarded the initial contract for implementation of the virtual ramp control systems within the new terminal facility.
- 2. Due to the proprietary nature of the virtual ramp control systems, Saab Inc. is solely qualified to meet necessary contractual obligations and maintain warranties on this City owned equipment.
- 3. Public solicitation would result in substantial increased cost for the City because of the proprietary nature of the virtual ramp control systems. Solicitation would require.
- 4. It is in the best interest of the City to utilize a contractor who has a unique or specialized experience for a specific project. This contractor has unique or specialized experience for this project.

Discussion

Project Justification: Wastewater arriving at the Blue River Wastewater Treatment Plant contain trash, debris, and personal care products. This material must be removed to prevent the debris from reaching local rivers and/or land applied with biosolids. The current screens are at the end of their service life and need to be replaced.

Project Description: This project includes the design, construction, and modifications of the existing Blue River Screen House located at 7300 Hawthorne Road, Kansas City, MO 64120. Modifications include replacement of existing screenings, channel flow separation, grit equalization, replacement of slide gates, HVAC improvements, and electrical improvements.

Solicitation/Bid Opening Date/Number of Bidders: This Design-Build project was advertised in accordance with the City's requirements. Three bidders submitted completed technical proposal packets on December 6, 2022. A public bid opening was held in the General Services Department on December 20, 2022 to open the cost proposals.

After proposals were submitted, the Water Services Department received technical proposal packets. The selection committee convened and assigned scoring to technical proposals based on the following:

- Project plans/management approach,
- Technical approach, and
- Construction schedule, planning and sequencing.



After technical proposals were awarded points, the highest technical proposal(s) was awarded 100 points. Points were then added to the other Technical Proposals corresponding to the 100 points and the original points earned by that Proposal.

After proposals were submitted, cost proposal packets were retained at the General Services Department. The lowest bid price was awarded 100 points. For the other bids, one (1) point was deducted for each percentage the base bid exceeded the lowest Base Bid.

Awardee: Radmacher Brothers Excavating Co., Inc. was selected as the lowest and most responsive bidder with a base bid price of \$4,583,900.00 & Technical Score of 100 for a score of 200/14% MBE and 14% WBE subcontracting participation.

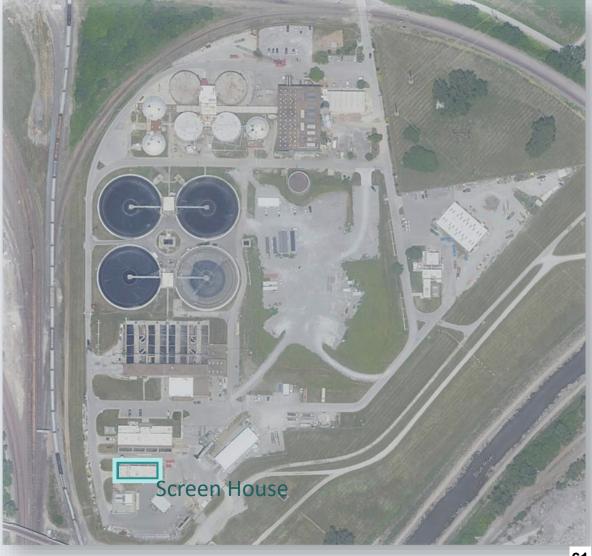

- (b) The city shall implement complete street elements within the general scope of roadway maintenance projects, which are not considered as major maintenance, and at no significant additional costs.
- (c) The city shall incorporate complete street elements and principles into public strategic plans, capital improvement plans, design standards, manuals, rules, regulations, and programs.
- (d) The city shall coordinate with, and enforce when applicable, the state, counties, public transportation providers, and neighboring jurisdictions to ensure that streets, bridges, and all other sidewalks and pathways connecting to other jurisdictions comply with the intent of complete streets. School districts, community improvement districts, and other special taxing districts shall comply with this complete streets article to ensure that streets, bridges, and all other connecting sidewalks and pathways not owned by the city but which are within the city limits comply with the intent of complete streets.
- (e) Private developments shall accommodate multimodal connections in accordance with chapter 88, Code of Ordinance.

- (f) The city shall approach every transportation improvement and project phase as an opportunity to create safer, more accessible streets for users. These phases include, but are not limited to programming, studies, pre-design, design, right-of-way acquisition, construction, construction engineering, reconstruction, operation, and major maintenance.

Bridges, viaducts, overpasses, and underpasses shall be designed and built with facilities recommended in the adopted. Sidewalks and bike facilities as identified in the Bike KC plan and Trails KC plan shall be included regardless of the presence of such facilities on the approach roadway.
- (j) Notification to both councilmembers in the district in which a bicycle lane(s) is proposed to be installed is required prior to the planning and design of the bicycle lane(s).
