Executive Summary

Authorizing a \$1,779,000.00 professional, specialized or technical services contract with AECOM Technical Services, Inc., for the Drinking Water Service Line Materials Inventory project.

Discussion

Project Justification

The Water Services Department is undertaking this professional, specialized or technical services project because a service line materials inventory is needed to be in compliance with the Environmental Protection Agency and Missouri Department of Natural Resources Safe Drinking Water Act revised Lead and Copper rule requirements for a completed documented inventory of service line materials for both public and private components and a method for the public to look up the information related to their service line.

Project Description

This project will develop an inventory of known and/or suspected locations of leaded lines and leaded service materials by reviewing all service line installation and construction records. This will result in a data inventory using Department data analytics and software to provide, among other deliverables, a public facing interface to provide data for ratepayers and users of the City's water supply and distribution system.

The term of this project will be 730 days.

Solicitation

This Project was advertised in accordance with the City's requirements. Proposals were received on August 4, 2022 with 5 consultants responding.

Awardee/Subcontracting Participation

AECOM Technical Services, Inc. was selected for this project with a contract amount of \$1,779,000.00, with subcontracting participation of 10% MBE and 10% WBE.

1. What will be the potential health impacts to any affected groups?



This legislation provides the initial identification across the City of locations where leaded lines and leaded service materials may have been installed since the initial formation of the Water Services Department in 1895. This program phase will identify user groups whom may have had leaded lines and leaded service materials installed in areas where such construction was considered acceptable and identify solutions.

2. How have those groups been engaged and involved in the development of this ordinance?

The purpose of this program phase is to identify constructed water service lines which may be of copper and/or lead nature. These will be identified on a geographic information system accessible by the public. Once locations where such leaded lines and leaded service materials may have been constructed, the Department will hold outreach events to identify short and long-term solutions to mitigate and/or eliminate such drinking water lines.

3. How does this legislation contribute to a sustainable Kansas City?

This project will contribute to a sustainable Kansas City by identifying known and suspected leaded lines and leaded service materials which have been identified by the Environmental Protection Agency as being a health concern. Future and immediate program phases will provide solutions to mitigate and/or eliminate such lines and therefore contributing to a healthier population and stronger neighborhoods and communities.

4. Does the ordinance/resolution include Civil Rights antidiscrimination requirements in compliance with the Code of Ordinances (Chapter 38, titled "Civil Rights")?

Yes. CREO KC established 10% MBE and 10% WBE goals on this project on May 17, 2022. This pre-dated the FY2023 CREO KC Annual Goal Program, which is for a period of June 2022 through June 2023.

There are also Affirmative Action Program requirements in this contract.

5. Has the ordinance/resolution been submitted for review of economic equity & inclusion requirements in compliance with the Code of Ordinances (Chapter 3, titled "Contracts and Leases")?

Yes. The Contractor Utilization Plan was submitted to CREO KC for review on February 17, 2023, and was approved on February 21, 2023 with 10% MBE and 10% WBE participation.

Executive Summary

Authorizing a \$1,500,000.00 Professional, Specialized or Technical Services contract with Ace Pipe Cleaning Inc., for Renewal No. 2 for the City-Wide Sewer Cleaning, Closed Circuit Television (CCTV) Inspection, and Manhole Locating and Opening for Overflow Control Program Project; and authorizing two successive renewal options with further City Council approval.

Discussion

Project Description: The scope of work provided under this contract entails project management and administrative services, sewer line cleaning of up to 590,000 linear feet of sewer, CCTV inspection of up to 590,000 linear feet of sewer, opening inoperable manhole covers, locating manholes currently not readily accessible, and clearing easements in wooded areas as necessary to gain access to manholes. This project is part of the City's Consent Decree with the United States Environmental Protection Agency.

City Council approved Ordinance No. 160311 on April 28, 2016, authorizing the original Contract No. 1277 for \$3,000,000.00, along with 4 renewals without City Council approval.

Each contract is a unit price-based contract. Ace Pipe Cleaning Inc. bid the unit price work for tree clearing and sewer heavy-line cleaning at lower unit costs than anticipated, and therefore, the total contract amount for Contract No. 1277-1 took longer to expend than originally planned.

Due to the extended time needed to complete Contract No. 1277-1, the work authorized under Ordinance No. 160311 took longer than a maximum term of six contract years to complete (per Code of Ordinances). We are bringing this project before City Council to request a time extension and approval to continue with Renewal No. 2 under Contract No. 1277-2 for \$1,500,000.00, and two successive renewal options with further City Council approval.

Ordinance No. 160311 was approved by City Council on April 28, 2016, authorizing a \$3,000,000.00 Professional, Specialized or Technical Services contract with Ace Pipe Cleaning, Inc.; authorizing a maximum expenditure of \$3,300,000.00; and authorizing four successive renewal options without further City Council approval.

Pursuant to Code of Ordinance Sec. 3-43(a), we are requesting a time extension to complete the remaining three contract renewals (1277-2, 1277-3, 1277-4).

Service Level Impacts

This project will improve the performance and reliability of the City's sewer systems, and provide condition assessment data to support future projects mandated by the City's Federal Consent Decree.

Other Impacts

This project will improve the performance and reliability of the City's sewer systems and provide condition assessment information that will be used to implement improvements to reduce the occurrence of sewer overflows and improve water quality of area streams and rivers.

This project protects the environment by cleaning the City's sewer system to reduce the occurrence of sewer overflows and provides asset condition assessment data to define future sewer rehabilitation projects.

Discussion

The ordinance authorizes an amedment to an existing design contract with TranSystems Corporation for additional design tasks related to the rehabilitation of the existing Benton Boulevard Bridge over Brush Creek.

The original design professional contract performed a study to assess the condition of the existing bridge and determine the best options for the City moving forward. This design amendment will allow for the completion of plans for the rehabilitation and restoration of the bridge in preparation for future construction funding in conjunction with the General Obligation Bonds in Fiscal year 2028.

At the time of the original contract award, CREO set participcation goals on the contract at fifteen (15%) MBE and ten (10%) WBE participation. The contract amendment complies with those goals.

Wear parts for the semi-annual preventative maintenance plan includes belts, batteries, motors, rubber seals and lamps. Executive Summary

Authorizing a \$2,429,674.00 construction contract with Leath & Sons, Inc., for the Water Main Replacement along Gladstone Boulevard to E. 18th Street, Blue Ridge Cutoff to Chelsea Avenue and Water Main Replacement N.E. 53rd Street and N. Agnes Avenue, N.E. Vivion Road to N. Walrond Avenue project; and authorizing a maximum expenditure of \$2,672,641.40.

Discussion

Project Justification

The Water Services Department is undertaking this construction project to improve distribution system reliability, increase hydraulic conveyance capacity, and support fire protection to replace aging, break-prone cast iron pipe (CIP) and polyvinyl chloride (PVC) water mains with ductile iron pipe (DIP).

Project Description

This project, which was designed by Taliaferro & Browne, Inc., includes the replacement of approximately 8,815 linear feet (LF) of 4-inch and 6-inch deteriorated and break-prone water mains along Gladstone Boulevard to E. 18th Street, Blue Ridge Cutoff to Chelsea Avenue and Water Main Replacement in the area of N.E. 53rd Street and N. Agnes Avenue, NE Vivion Road to N. Walrond Avenue, in Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri. The project will replace the water mains in the following areas:

- Replace 790 LF of 6-inch CIP water main with 8-inch DIP along Chelsea Avenue between Gladstone Boulevard and Sunrise Drive;
- Replace 1,410 LF of 6-inch CIP water main with 8-inch DIP along Chelsea Avenue between Smart Avenue and Independence Avenue;
- Replace 1,445 LF of 6-inch CIP water main with 8-inch DIP along E. 9th Street between Hardesty Avenue and Brighton Avenue;
- Replace 1,430 LF of 6-inch CIP water main with 8-inch DIP along Oakland Avenue between E. 17th Street and E. Truman Road:



- Replace 800 LF of 6-inch CIP water main with 8-inch DIP along E. 8th Street between Blue Ridge Boulevard and Lewis Avenue;

Awardee/Subcontracting Participation

Leath & Sons, Inc. was selected as the lowest and most responsive bidder with a base bid of \$2,429,674.00, with subcontracting participation of 11% MBE and 11% WBE.

Other Bidders/Subcontracting Participation

Infrastructure Solutions, LLC submitted a bid on this project at the amount of \$2,708,000.00. They did not submit any 48-hour M/WBE paperwork so their bid is considered non-responsive.

Estimated Opinion of Probable Construction Costs

The estimated opinion of probable construction cost on this projects is \$3,553,000.00.
