WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 190175 established the General Obligation Series 2020A Question 2 Bond Fund for use on flood control projects via a Special Election that occurred on April 4, 2017; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 200216 amended Ordinance No. 200152 which authorized the sale and issuance of the General Obligation Series 2020A Bonds that funded projects appropriated in the General Obligation Series 2020A Question 2 Bond Fund; and

WHEREAS, the General Obligation Series 2020A Bonds were issued on April 29, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the Water Services Department completed a \$497,000.00 emergency construction contract with SHEDIGS IT, LLC for the Wornall Road Bridge Over Indian Creek Hydraulic Restriction Removal project in 2023, which was for emergency flood control work in the area east of 103rd Street and Wornall Road; and

WHEREAS, work on this project was completed in 2023 and contract execution and payment to the contractor is pending; and

WHEREAS, an ordinance is needed to transfer funds from one GO Bond account in Public Works to a GO Bond account in Water Services; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KANSAS CITY:

Executive Summary

Authorizing the transfer of \$497,000.00 in the General Obligation Series 2020A Question 2 Bond Fund from a Public Works Department project to the corresponding Water Services Department account and project in the General Obligation Series 2020A Question 2 Bond Fund; and designating the Director of Water Services as requisitioning authority.

Discussion

Project/Ordinance Justification

This project is for flood control work for the Wornall Road Bridge Over Indian Creek Hydraulic Restriction Removal. A solicitation waiver was approved by the Director of Water Services on January 20, 2023 approving an emergency contract with WBE firm SHEDIGS IT, LLC to perform this work.

The reason for the emergency contract was due to the Wornall Road Bridge did not have sufficient clearance between the bottom of the bridge beams to the existing ground elevation. Due to the Indian Creek Trail underneath the bridge, there existed the potential for people to be impacted with the historical recurrent flash flooding along Indian Creek and 103rd Street.

The nature of the bridge also caused sedimentation and debris accumulation on the trail which reduced the reliability of the trail and user experience. The proposed improvement removed earth to a depth of rock which increased clearances and allowed for reduced life safety incidences underneath the bridge. SHEDIGS IT, LLC was selected to perform this emergency work as they had completed emergency repairs to water utility infrastructure in the area and was familiar with the site and City's underground utilities under the bridge in order to complete the improvement before the spring flooding season.

Work was performed and completed in 2023 and contract execution and payment to the contractor is pending.

An ordinance is needed to transfer funds from one GO Bond account in Public Works to a GO Bond account in Water Services.

Project Description:

The work performed on the Wornall Road Bridge over Indian Creek was located immediately east of the old Coaches Bar and Grill at 103rd and Wornall Road and this flood control work was performed at a later phase from the buyout of structures on nearby Washington Street.

Work on this project involved the following:

- Remove 10,000 cubic yards of material from under the bridge, which as a 50 year life span;
- Place 4,000 square feet of concrete slope protection on north end of the bridge;
- Replace 3,200 square feet of concrete trail (about 400 ft x 8 ft), north end;
- Place 250 tons of additional rip-rap to protect slope on south end; and
- Final grading and seeding on disturbed areas.

Amending Chapter 3 of the Code of Ordinances of the Kansas City, Missouri, Contracts and Leases, by repealing Section 3-31, Contract Award, and enacting in lieu thereof a new section of like number and subject matter.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KANSAS CITY:

Section 1. That Chapter 3, Code of Ordinances, entitled "Contracts and Leases," relating to Contract Award, is hereby amended by repealing Section 3-31, and enacting in lieu thereof a new section of like number and subject matter, to read as follows:

Sec. 3-31. Contract award.

(a) *General standard.* Except as otherwise provided in this division 2, all contracts in which bids or proposals were required shall be awarded to the lowest and best bidder or best proposer as determined by the city in the city's sole discretion, after due opportunity for competition.

(b) *Design professional contracts.* A qualification based selection shall be made based upon the statement of qualifications that was required to be submitted and any supplement thereto as requested by the city. The process for making the qualification based selection shall be determined by the estimated dollar value of the design professional contract as follows, provided however that the failure to utilize the applicable process shall not invalidate any public improvement procurement or any contract:

- (1) *Contracts exceeding \$600,000.00.* The city shall convene an architect and engineering selection committee, which committee shall rank the firms from most to least qualified. The committee shall be comprised of at least one member designated by the city manager and two members designated by the director of the contracting department. The mayor may elect to be a member of the committee or may designate a council member to serve on the committee and if the mayor so elects, the director of the contracting department shall designate one less member to the committee.
- (2) *Contracts less than \$600,000.00.* The director of the contracting department shall rank the firms from most to least qualified. If the cost proposal from the highest

ranked firm is an amount that exceeds 700,000.00, the director shall not recommend award and the director shall convene an architect and engineering selection committee in accordance with Section 3-31(b)(1).

The city shall thereafter negotiate a contract for the project with the firm selected as most qualified. If the city is unable to negotiate a satisfactory contract with the firm selected, negotiations with that firm shall be terminated. The city shall then undertake negotiations with another of the qualified firms selected. If there is no agreement with the second firm, negotiations with such firm shall be terminated. The city shall then undertake negotiations with the third qualified firm. If the city is unable to negotiate a contract with any of the selected firms, the city shall reevaluate the necessary architectural, engineering or land surveying services, including the scope and reasonable fee requirements, and again conduct a qualification based selection process. Notwithstanding the foregoing, nothing herein shall obligate the city to undertake any negotiations if the city shall have determined to terminate the solicitation for any or no reason.

(c) *Design-build contracts*. Contracts shall be awarded as is appropriate to the manner in which the contract was solicited, as follows:

- (1) *Best value*. To the responsible design-build firm whose proposal is evaluated as providing the best value to the city based on any factors and method and formula included in the request for proposals. The city may elect to establish a fixed dollar budget for the project such that all proposers are operating under the same monetary limitations.
- (2) *Qualification-based*. A qualification based selection shall be made based upon the statement of qualifications that was required to be submitted. The process for making the qualification based selection shall be determined by the estimated dollar value of the design-build contract as follows, provided however that the failure to utilize the applicable process shall not invalidate any public improvement procurement or any contract:
 - i. *Contracts exceeding \$6,000,000,00*. The city shall convene an architect and engineering selection committee, which committee shall rank the design-builder from most to least qualified. The committee shall be comprised of one member designated by the city manager and four members designated by the director of the contracting department. The mayor may elect to be a member of the committee or may designate a council member to serve on the committee and if the mayor so elects, the director of the contracting department shall designate one less member to the committee.
 - ii. *Contracts* \$6,000,000.00 or *less*. The director of the contracting department shall rank the design-builder from most to least qualified. If the cost proposal from the highest ranked firm is an amount that exceeds \$7,000,000.00, the director shall not recommend award and the director

shall convene an architect and engineering selection committee in accordance with Section 3-31(c)(2)(i). The city shall thereafter negotiate a contract for the project with the firm selected as most qualified. If the city is unable to negotiate a satisfactory contract with the firm selected, negotiations with that firm shall be terminated. The city shall then undertake negotiations with another of the qualified firms selected. If there is no agreement with the second firm, negotiations with such firm shall be terminated. The city shall then undertake negotiations with another of the qualified firms selected. If there is no agreement with the second firm, negotiations with such firm shall be terminated. The city shall then undertake negotiations with the third qualified firm. If the city is unable to negotiate a contract with any of the selected firms, the city shall reevaluate the scope of the project and again conduct a qualification based selection process. Notwithstanding the foregoing, nothing herein shall obligate the city to undertake any negotiations if the city shall have determined to terminate the solicitation for any or no reason.

(3) *Two-phase.* The design-builders shall be ranked from most to least qualified in such manner as provided in subsection (c)(2) and a value shall be assigned based upon the rankings. The city shall thereafter evaluate and score any proposal or bid required to be submitted and shall identify the best proposal or the lowest and best bid, as applicable. The city shall thereafter negotiate a contract for the project with the firm selected as having the best proposal or execute a contract for the project with the firm having the lowest and best bid. If the city is unable to negotiate a satisfactory contract or execute a contract, the city shall then proceed to the next best proposal or next lowest and best bid, and such process shall continue in similar fashion unless the city shall have determined to terminate the solicitation.

Discussion

Reason for Contract

In 2010, the City of Kansas City, Missouri entered into a Consent Decree with the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) to reduce the volume and frequency of overflows from the City's sewer system. The City's Smart Sewer Program is currently in year 14 of a 30-year implementation period. The purpose of this project is to reduce inflow and infiltration (I/I) flows in the sanitary sewer system. System information was gathered to identify and quantify I/I sources and to develop rehabilitation and I/I source reduction recommendations. Activities will include various sewer rehabilitation methods to reduce I/I and to restore the service life of existing sewers in the project area.

Construction Contract Description

The scope of work to be provided under the construction contract includes rehabilitation or replacement of approximately 370 manholes, 29,000 linear feet (LF) of sewer main ranging in diameter from 8-inches to 24-inches, and 470 associated services lateral connections. The total amount of the proposed construction contract is \$6,045,610.00.
