



Authorizing the Director of Public Works to enter into a one-year cooperative agreement with Bike Share KC in the amount of \$452,400.00 from funds previously appropriated for a bicycle-sharing program; authorizing the continued installation of bicycle stations within the public right-of-way; and granting a waiver of the application fee.

WHEREAS, Bike Share KC is a Missouri nonprofit corporation that has developed and operated a public bicycle-sharing rental program in the greater Kansas City metropolitan area since 2012; and

WHEREAS, the program has provided a low-cost transportation option for short trips as well as opportunities for transportation, recreation, and fitness; and

WHEREAS, the annual usage of the bike share program has grown to over 20,000 users per year and resulted in over 275,000 pounds of carbon emissions reduced since the program was launched; and

WHEREAS, for a bicycle-sharing program to be successful, program facilities must be placed at locations throughout the City that prioritize visibility, location, desirability, convenience, and equity - among other considerations - but due to a lack of sufficient public or private open space at optimal locations, it will be necessary to place some of the facilities of a bicycle-sharing program within the City right-of-way, including on sidewalks; and

WHEREAS, the placement and location of bicycle stations shall follow a defined process with input from key stakeholders; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KANSAS CITY:

Section 1. That the Director of Public Works is authorized to enter into a cooperative agreement with Bike Share KC for the installation, management, and maintenance of public bike sharing stations and bicycles until April 30, 2025 in the amount of \$452,400.00 from funds previously appropriated to account No. 25-2080-891319-B. A copy of the agreement is on file in the office of the City Manager.

Section 2. As authorized by Section 64-169 of the Code of Ordinances, the Council gives permission to Bike Share KC to install, operate, and maintain bicycle stations within the public right-of-way.

Section 3. That in accordance with Section 64-169 of the Code of Ordinances, the Council finds it in the public interest to grant a waiver of the application fee. ..end

The City has no financial obligation under both this Ordinance and Contract until the Director of Public Works issues a Purchase Order which shall be signed by the City's Director of Finance certifying there is a balance, otherwise unencumbered, the credit of the appropriation to which the expenditure is to be charged, and a cash balance, otherwise unencumbered, in the treasury, to the credit of the fund from which payment will be made, each sufficient to meet the obligation incurred in the Purchase Order.

An Ordinance to authorize Ride KC Bike to offer bike share services in Kansas City, Missouri

Discussion

This ordinance would authorize the Director of Public works to enter into an agreement with BikeShare KC for the installation, management, and maintenance of public bike sharing stations and bicycles.

The ordinance allows the Director of Public Works to enter into a cooperative agreement until April 31st, 2025. The cooperative agreement may include matching funds for the procurement of more bike share bikes. This procurement would necessarily require future operations and maintenance funds in the subsequent contracts.

Yes, bicycles and other mobility devices offer less tear on our roadways, so they may not need resurfaced as often as if automobiles were driving on this pavement.

WHEREAS, the Director of Public Works authorized Design Professional Services Agreement Amendment No. 1 with TranSystems Corporation in the amount of \$39,785.00 for additional design study scope items; and

WHEREAS, City Council approved Ordinance No. 220234 which authorized Design Professional Services Agreement Amendment No. 2 in the amount of \$310,600.00 for construction phase services and field observation for N. Stark Avenue improvements; and

WHEREAS, Amendment No. 3 is needed to complete final design for N.E. 112th Street improvements from N. Stark Avenue to the east City Limits, including a new bridge over Fishing River Tributary and limited construction phase services; and

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KANSAS CITY:

Section 1. That the Director of Public Works is hereby authorized to execute a Design Professional Services Agreement Amendment No. 3 with TranSystems Corporation in the amount of \$1,000,000.00 for Project No. 89008835 (formerly 89008700) — N.E. 112th Street from N. Executive Summary

Authorizing Amendment No. 3 to a Design Professional Services Agreement with TranSystems Corporation in the amount of \$1,000,000.00 for the NE 112th Street Improvements project for a total contract amount of \$1,705,700.00; and recognizing this ordinance as having an accelerated effective date.

Discussion

Amendment No. 3 is needed to complete final design for NE 112th Street improvements from N Stark Avenue to the east City Limits, including a new bridge over Fishing River Tributary and limited construction phase services. Current project number is 89008835; original contract and previous amendments were under project number 89008700 due to phased study, design, and construction scopes of work.

Construction funding is anticipated to be provided through GO Bonds (Question 1) in Fiscal Years 2026 & 2027 (\$10 Million per Ord. 230935).

MBE and WBE goals for design have been approved at 15% and 10% respectively as established in the original contract (PeopleSoft Contract ID = CS180043).
