# RESOLUTION NO. 220402

Directing the City Manager to report in 120 days on a plan to evaluate the feasibility of providing suitable space for a Nursing Room in City public buildings for City employees and members of the public; and the City Manager shall report back to the City Council prior to beginning any Nursing Room project.

WHEREAS, Federal Law requires employers to provide "a place, other than a bathroom, that is shielded from view and free from intrusion from coworkers and the public, which may be used by an employee to express breast milk;" and

WHEREAS, Congress enacted the Fairness For Breastfeeding Mothers Act that set forth requirements for certain Federal Buildings to provide a lactation room for use by the public where feasible; and

WHEREAS, Fairness For Breastfeeding Mothers Act can serve as a model for the City's policy; and

WHEREAS, without designated nursing space, City employees are challenged with identifying space that can appropriately be used as a lactation room; and

WHEREAS, providing employees access to a Nursing Room ("Mother's Room") helps employees balance family and work commitments, improves employee morale, retention and recruiting; , creates a positive breastfeeding-friendly worksite and shows that the City values the contributions of working women in our departments; and

WHEREAS, providing a Mother's Room can positively impact retention rates, resulting in potential cost savings to the City; NOW, THEREFORE,

# BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF KANSAS CITY:

Section 1. That the City Manager is directed to report in 120 days on a plan to evaluate the feasibility of providing a Nursing Room in City public buildings, and to establish priority standards that will guide recommendations on building amenity needs to accommodate a Nursing room.

Section 2. That the City Manager is directed to report back to the City Council prior to beginning any Nursing Room project other than the 8<sup>th</sup> Floor Nursing Room.

RESOLUTION - Designating the City's share of Platte County's special road and bridge tax receipts for calendar years 2020, 2021, and 2022 to be allocated to North Coventry between N.W. 68th Street and N.W. 76th Street per RSMo 137.556; and directing the City Manager to transmit this resolution to Platte County. \*\*\*This item will be held for one week\*\*\*

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to use the City of Kansas City's share of Platte County's special road and bridge tax receipts to fund construction projects of mutual benefit to the City of Kansas City and Platte County; and

WHEREAS, RSMo 137.556 states that "The city council or other governing body of the city, town or village shall designate the roads, streets and bridges to be repaired and improved and shall specify the kinds and types of materials to be used"; and

WHEREAS, previous Platte County special road and bridge tax receipts have been used successfully on improvements to Barry Road at I-29, N.W. 72nd Street between Route 9 and I-29 serving Plaza Middle School, N.W. 64th Street at I-29, and North Green Hills Road between N.W. 78th Street and N.W. Barry Road; and

WHEREAS, North Coventry is an unimproved and narrow road lacking sidewalks, curbs, and streetlights which serves the recently opened Park Hill High School LEAD Center which is the third high school in the district and the school district is completing improvements to a portion of North Coventry; and

WHEREAS, funds from Platte County for calendar year 2020 collected were \$1,049,000.82, funds from Platte County for calendar year 2021 collected were \$989,676.89, funds for calendar year 2022 are estimated to be \$1,000,000.00 all of which can be used for improvements to North Coventry between N.W. 68th Street and N.W. 76th Street; NOW, THEREFORE,

# BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF KANSAS CITY:

Section 1. That the City Council hereby designates, per RSMo 137.556, that the City's share of Platte County's special road and bridge tax receipts for calendar years 2020, 2021, and 2022 are to be used for improvements to North Coventry between N.W. 68th Street and N.W. 76th Street, using such materials as specified in City ordinance and contract.

Section 2. That the City Manager is hereby directed to incorporate the provisions of this resolution into the appropriate budgets.

Section 3. That the City Manager is hereby instructed to transmit this resolution to Platte County within 30 days.

### Reason for Contract

This construction project will be performed to replace aging, breakprone cast iron pipe (CIP) and polyvinyl chloride (PVC) water mains with ductile iron pipe (DIP).

### Discussion

## Project Justification

The Water Services Department is undertaking this construction project to improve distribution system reliability, increase hydraulic conveyance capacity, and support fire protection.

### Project Description

This project includes the replacement of approximately 7,200 linear feet (LF) of break prone 2-inch, 4-inch, 6-inch, 8-inch, and 12-inch deteriorated and break-prone water mains in the area of N. Cherry Drive to N. Harrison Drive, N.E. 79th Street to N.E. 102nd Terrace, in Kansas City, Clay County, Missouri.

The project will replace the water mains in the following locations:

- Replace approximately 450 feet of 8-inch CIP water main with 8inch DIP water main along N. Cherry Drive from N.E. New Mark Drive to 450 feet north;
- Replace approximately 250 feet of 12-inch CIP water main with 12-inch DIP water main along N.E. New Mark Drive from N. Cherry Drive to N. Charlotte Street;
- Replace approximately 1,400 feet of 8-inch CIP water main with 8-inch DIP water main along N. Charlotte Street from N.E. New Mark Drive to N. Harrison Drive;
- Replace approximately 250 feet of 6-inch CIP water main with 6inch DIP water main along N.E. 100th Terrace from N. Charlotte Street to the end of the cul-de-sac;
- Replace approximately 1,550 feet of 6-inch CIP water main with 8-inch DIP water main along N. Harrison Drive from N. Charlotte Street to N. Campbell Drive;
- Replace approximately 300 feet of 2-inch CIP water main with 6inch DIP water main along N. Charlotte Street (cul-de-sac) from N. Charlotte Street to end of the cul-de-sac;
- Replace approximately 200 feet of 2-inch CIP water main with 6inch DIP water main along N. Charlotte Street (cul-de-sac) from N. Charlotte Street to end of the cul-de-sac;
- Replace approximately 1,200 feet of 4-inch and 12-inch CIP water main with 12-inch DIP water main along N.E. 79th Terrace from N. Cherry Street to N. Campbell Street; and
- Replace approximately 1,600 feet of 8-inch CIP water main with 8-inch DIP water main along N.E. Barry Road from N. Oak Trafficway to N. Boone Street.

Declaring certain real property located at 700 N.E. 90th Street, Kansas City, Missouri 64155 surplus to the City's needs; authorizing the Director of General Services to offer the sale of the City's interest in this real property in accordance with City regulations, and execute related documents to complete the transfer of the real property while reserving easements, as necessary, for any existing City owned sewer, storm water, and water line infrastructure on the said property.

Subject to building lines, easements, reservation, restrictions, covenants and conditions of record.

Further subject to any and all other existing easements, right of way, and/or any other encumbrances, recorded or non-recorded, affecting the real property, and also subject to a

The City of Kansas City, Missouri desires to improve quality and efficiency of the street lighting system, enhance driver and pedestrian safety, and reduce annual energy and maintenance costs. Therefore, they solicited competitive detailed proposals for conversion of the estimated 84,000 standard cobrahead streetlights from high pressure sodium to LEDs, as well as the on-going annual maintenance of approximately 98,000 streetlight and 41 traffic signal system. The conversion of the streetlight is to be completed in a 36 months period with work performed concurrently in every Council District. The cumulative cost savings were to offset all upfront costs within a maximum 10 years of project commencement based on available annual funding of estimated \$13 million adjusted for price increases (energy and maintenance annual cost).

It was determined that Black & McDonald, LLC provided the best and lowest proposal and was selected as a successful proposer to convert the streetlights to LEDs and provide annual maintenance services. # **RESOLUTION NO. TMP-1853**

Declaring the City's support of balanced energy options that achieve climate goals inclusive of natural gas and renewable natural gas strategies, its commitment to considering the inequities of higher energy costs upon marginalized communities and its opposition to legislation or policies that eliminate energy options for local energy consumers by mandating certain fuel sources or energy-specific technologies. \*\*\*This item will be held for one week\*\*\*

WHEREAS, state legislatures, state agencies and local municipalities across the United States are increasingly proposing new legislation and regulations eliminating energy options for local energy consumers by mandating only certain energy sources to power buildings and public and private fleets as a strategy to achieve climate goals; and

WHEREAS, clean, affordable and reliable energy is crucial to the health, safety and wellbeing of Kansas City, Missouri, residents, particularly the most vulnerable who live on fixed and limited incomes, including seniors and working families who are struggling financially; and

WHEREAS, the need for clean, affordable and reliable energy to attract and retain businesses, create jobs and spur economic development is vital to our city's success in a highly competitive and increasingly regional and global marketplace; and

WHEREAS, the City of Kansas City, Missouri, and its residents and businesses value energy options, policies and investments that most affordably and efficiently enable them to support local energy and climate goals and objectives; and

WHEREAS, the City opposes any mandate that eliminates energy options for local energy consumers as such policies suppress economic development and innovation, reduce reliability, disregard fiscal responsibility, impede energy efficiency and unnecessarily increase costs for residents and businesses; and

WHEREAS, this resolution supports the efforts of all industries within the energy sector that are working toward the goal of carbon neutrality via a balanced approach to meeting local and state environmental goals, and moreover, this resolution opposes legislation and policies that would eliminate energy options for local energy consumers with respect to building and vehicle energy resources and technologies; and

WHEREAS, the City understands that its social, environmental and economic resilience rely upon diverse energy options, and that relying on a single energy source increases vulnerabilities to climate change, natural disasters, system failures, global and domestic energy instability, and that a diversity of energy delivery systems and resources contribute to greater reliability and community resilience; and

WHEREAS, the City understands the need for sustainability and is committed to achieving its climate goals, but resolves to maintain the flexibility to do so in a manner that best serves the needs of its residents and businesses; and

WHEREAS, in the pursuit of an inclusive, equitable approach toward innovative, data driven and practical strategies to maximize the benefits obtained from all energy sources, including natural gas and renewable natural gas, the City will encourage the balanced use of all sources of energy to meet the energy needs of the city and to avert undesirable environmental and economic consequences of dependence on a single source of energy as the City pursues the reduction of greenhouse gas emissions and other relevant climate protection and resiliency goals; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF KANSAS CITY:

That the City supports balanced energy options that provide the City, its residents, and its businesses with the decision-making authority and resources necessary to achieve climate goals inclusive of natural gas and renewable natural gas strategies, technologies and solutions; the City will duly consider the inequity of higher energy costs and emissions upon marginalized communities least able to withstand their impact; and the City opposes any legislation or policy that eliminates energy options for local energy consumers by mandating certain fuel sources or energy-specific technologies for the powering of buildings, fueling of vehicles or generation of power within the City.
