#### ORDINANCE NO. 220622

Declaring certain real property generally located at 4250 N.E. Birmingham Road, Kansas City, Missouri 64117 surplus to the City's needs; authorizing the Director of General Services to offer the sale of the City's interest in this real property in accordance with City regulations, and execute related documents to complete the transfer of the real property while reserving easements, as necessary, for any existing City owned sewer, storm water, and water line infrastructure on the said property.

WHEREAS, all City departments have been notified and this property is not needed by the City and no interest has been expressed in retaining the land for future public use; and

WHEREAS, the City owns rights in certain real property generally located at 4250 N.E. Birmingham Road, Kansas City, Clay County, Missouri; and

WHEREAS, all existing easements, right of way, and/or any other encumbrances affecting the real property, shall remain in effect as set forth in the Quitclaim Deed executed as a part of the subsequent transfer; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KANSAS CITY:

Section 1. That the parcels described below, are hereby declared surplus to the City's needs.

Section 2. That the Director of General Services Department is hereby authorized to currently offer for sale in accord with City regulations, and make available through an open and public competition, with such conditions determined appropriate by the Director of General Services, the City's rights in the property located at 4250 N.E. Birmingham Road, Kansas City, Clay County, Missouri, in one transaction, to a single purchaser, legally described as follows:

#### Tract 1:

"A tract of land being the North Half of the abandon 150 feet wide Chicago, Milwaukee, St. Paul and Pacific Railroad Company as described in the Recorded Document in Book 454 Page 209 in the Northwest Quarter of Section 17, Township 50 North, Range 32 West, in the City of Randolph, Clay County, Missouri being more particularly described as follows: Commencing at the Northwest Corner of Said Northwest Quarter; thence South 01 degrees 07 minutes 54 seconds West, along the West line of said Northwest Quarter, 717.17 feet, to the North right of way of the Chicago, Milwaukee, St. Paul, and Pacific Railroad Company, as now established; thence along said North right of way the following two courses: thence on a curve to the left, with Initial tangent bearing of South 88 degrees 46 minutes 36 seconds east, having a radius of 1361.59 feet and an arc length of 737.74 feet; thence North 60 degrees 10 minutes 45 seconds east, 412.51 feet; thence South 29 degrees 43 minutes 35 seconds east, 75.00 feet; thence South 60 degrees 10 minutes 54 seconds west, along the centerline of said railroad, 412.64 feet; thence on a curve to the right, having a radius of 1436.59 feet, and an arc length of 778.20 feet, to the said West line, of said Northwest Quarter; thence North 01 degrees 07 minutes 54 seconds east, along the said West line, 75.00 feet, to the Point of Beginning."

Beginning at the Northwest Corner of Lot 107, RANDOLH HEIGHTS, a subdivision in Kansas City, Clay County, Missouri, recorded in Plat Book C Page 138; thence North 12 degrees 20 minutes 58 seconds west, 75.00 feet; thence on a curve to the Left, with a radius of 1436.59 feet, an initial tangent bearing of North 77 degrees 39 minutes 02 seconds east, and an arc length of 138.64 feet; thence South 17 degrees 52 minutes 44 seconds east, 75.00 feet to the North East Corner of Lot said 107; thence on a curve to the right, with a radius of 1511.58 feet, an initial tangent bearing of South 72 degrees 07 minutes 16 seconds west, and an arc length of 145.88 feet, to the Point of Beginning."

Commencing at the Northwest corner, of said Northwest Quarter; thence South 01 degrees 07 minutes 54 seconds west, along the West line of said Northwest Quarter, 443.47 feet, to the South right of way line of 210 Highway, as now established, said Point also being the Point of Beginning; thence along said South right of way the following four courses; thence North 86 degrees 57 minutes 14 seconds east, 185.46 feet; thence North 65 degrees 09 minutes 09 seconds east, 107.70 feet; thence North 86 degrees 57 minutes 14 seconds east, 495.80 feet;

thence North 83 degrees 52 minutes 55 seconds east, 282.40 feet, to the North right of way line of Chicago, Milwaukee & St. Paul Railroad, as established; thence along said North right of way line the following 2 courses; thence South 60 degrees 10 minutes 54 seconds west, 412.76 feet; thence on a curve to the right, tangent to the last described course, having a radius of 1361.59 feet and an arc length of 737.68 feet, to the West line of said Northwest Quarter; thence North 01 degrees 07 minutes 54 seconds east, along said West line, 273.70 feet, to the Point of Beginning."

Subject to building lines, easements, reservation, restrictions, covenants and conditions of record.

Further subject to any and all other existing easements, right of way, and/or any other encumbrances, recorded or non-recorded, affecting the real property, and also subject to a reservation of easements, as necessary, for City owned sewer, storm water, and/or water line infrastructure located on the said property and existing on or before the execution of this Quitclaim Deed.,

Section 3. That the Director of General Services is hereby authorized to execute any real estate or other documents needed to effectuate this transaction. ...end

WHEREAS, Spire Missouri Inc., successor in interest to The Empire District Gas Company, has requested a new franchise authorizing it to continue to provide natural gas service to Kansas City, Missouri and its inhabitants; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KANSAS CITY:

Section 1. That the Director Public Works is authorized to execute the Franchise Agreement with Spire Missouri Inc. granting a non-exclusive 10-year franchise to operate a natural gas distribution plant and system within territory of the City of Kansas City, Missouri. WHEREAS, the Main Streetcar Rail Transportation Development District ("TDD") has been formed, approved by voters within the district, and determined to be sufficient for providing necessary local funding; and

WHEREAS, the City has developed a financial plan using a combination of local, state, and Federal funds to finance the costs of the Project and, in accordance with the plan, has requested Federal financial assistance by the U.S. Government pursuant to the laws codified at 49 U.S.C. Chapter 53; and

WHEREAS, the U.S. Government, acting through the Federal Transit Administration ("FTA") has entered into a Full Funding Grant Agreement ("FFGA") to support final design and construction of the project up to a Maximum Federal Section 5309 Capital Investment Grants Program Financial Contribution of \$174,059,270.00, subject to all the terms and conditions set forth in the FFGA; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 210162 authorized the estimation and appropriation of \$10,060,000.00 of Federal Transit Administration grant proceeds and special obligation bond proceeds; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 210486 authorized the estimation and appropriation of \$74,000,000.00 of Federal Transit Administration grant proceeds and special obligation bond proceeds of which \$540,278.00 remains unencumbered; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 211096 authorized the estimation and appropriation of \$207,065,514.00 of Federal Transit Administration grant proceeds and special obligation bond proceeds; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 210751 authorized the restructuring of Phase 2 construction services into Phase 2A, Advanced Work Packages, for an amount not to exceed \$8,084,733.00, and authorized negotiation of a final guaranteed maximum price (FGMP) with Kansas City Streetcar Constructors; and

WHEREAS, all phases will be performed in accordance with requirements defined in the contract authorized by Ordinance No. 200165; and

WHEREAS, Amendment #2 authorized the restructuring of Phase 2 construction services into Phase 2A, Advanced Work Packages, and Phase 2B to procure track materials, rebar for OCS foundations and storm drainage for Segment 6 and 7 and authorized the expenditure of up to \$663,430.87 for Phase 2B; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 211096 authorized the appropriation of \$ 207,065,514.00, of which \$79,066,186.00 are bond proceeds and \$127,999,328.00 are federal grant proceeds, for the purpose of continuing work on the project; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to estimate and appropriate \$16,500,000.00 of which \$8,334,150.00 are bond proceeds and \$8,165,850.00 are federal grant proceeds, for the purpose of continuing work on the project; and

WHEREAS, the cost of the project will be funded with the issuance of special obligation bonds in Spring 2023 and grant proceeds from the FTA Capital Investment Grant and the payment of scheduled debt service payments on the bonds will be made by annual appropriation of monies from general municipal revenues over a successive twenty-five (25) year period, with the TDD as the primary source of repayment;

WHEREAS, the City desires to amend the contract with Alfred Benesch & Company for additional construction / engineering services during the construction phase of the Kansas City Streetcar Main Street Extension Project;

WHEREAS, the City desires to amend the contract with KC Streetcar Constructors for construction services during the construction phase of the Kansas City Streetcar Main Street Extension Project; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KANSAS CITY:

Section 1. That Fund No. 3447 is hereby established as the Special Obligation Series 2023A Streetcar Project Fund in the records of the City of Kansas City, Missouri.

Section 2.That the revenues in the following account of Fund No. 3447, the SpecialObligation Series 2023A Streetcar Project Fund, are hereby estimated in the following amounts:AL-3447-120000-590000Bond ProceedsAL-3447-895990-474630Federal Grant Revenue8,165,850.00TOTAL:\$16,500,000.00

Section 3. That the sum of \$16,500,000.00 is hereby appropriated from the Unappropriated Fund Balance of the Special Obligation Series 2023A Streetcar Project Fund, to the following accounts:

AL-3447-898990-B-89022014	Streetcar Extension Bonds	\$8,334,150.00
AL-3447-895990-B-89022014	Streetcar Extension Grant	8,165,850.00
	TOTAL:	\$16,500,000.00

Section 4. That the Director of Public Works is designated as requisitioning authority for Account No. AL-3447-898990-89022014 and AL-3447-895990-89022014.

Section 5. That the City Council hereby declares its official intent to reimburse itself for certain expenditures made within sixty (60) days prior to or on and after the date of this Ordinance with respect to appropriations in Section 3 (the "Appropriation") with the proceeds of bonds expected to be issued by the City. The maximum principal amount of bonds expected to be issued for the Appropriation is not to exceed \$16,500,000.00. This constitutes a declaration of official intent under Treasury Regulation 1.150-2.

Section 6. #### BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KANSAS CITY, MISSOURI:

Section 1. That the property interests herein described are hereby authorized condemned and taken for permanent and temporary public use in and upon the land hereinafter described for Project No. 89020225, "KCI Corridor Trail Segment 1", including any necessary structures or appurtenances, all in Kansas City, Platte County, Missouri.

#### Pedestrian Right of Way Easement

The Pedestrian Right of Way Easement shall be used by the City of Kansas City, Missouri for public recreational purposes and is part of the Metro Green regional recreational trails/greenway system, through part of the City of Kansas City, Platte County, Missouri. Said Pedestrian Right of Way Easement shall include the right to clear, cut, fell, remove, and dispose of any and all timber, trees, underbrush, and/or other obstructions there from; to grade, excavate, cut away, and remove any of said land and to replace thereon other material; to construct and maintain the greenway system for trails for walking, running, bicycling, and other recreational purposes; to post signs on the easement property notifying the public of their rights and responsibilities in the use and enjoyment of the recreational trail; for the movement and operation of public safety personnel and vehicles: and for such other purposes as may be required in connection with said work of improvement: reserving, however to the owners, their heirs and assigns, all such rights and privileges as may be used without interfering with or abridging the rights and easement hereby established.

The acquisition of this Pedestrian Right of Way Easement, shall not be construed to prohibit the owners, their heirs and assigns from developing any adjoining property as long as said development does not extend into, under, on, or over said easement without first acquiring written approval from the Director of Public Works; or inhibit the Grantee, or its agents, in entering upon said easement for the purpose of laying, constructing, operating, maintaining, repairing, reconstructing, and making improvements to the Infrastructure there in; or in any way interfere with the safe, unrestricted and continuous use of the easement by the public.

#### **Temporary Construction Easement**

The acquisition of this Pedestrian Right of Way Easement, shall not be construed to prohibit the owners, their heirs and assigns from developing any adjoining property as long as said development does not extend into, under, on, or over said easement without first acquiring written approval from the Director of Public Works; or inhibit the Grantee, or its agents, in entering upon said easement for the purpose of laying, constructing, operating, maintaining, repairing, reconstructing, and making improvements to the Infrastructure there in; or in any way interfere with the safe, unrestricted and continuous use of the easement by the public.

#### **Temporary Construction Easement**

The Temporary Construction Easements shall be used by the City of Kansas City, Missouri or its authorized agents, servants, employees, or independent contractors, during the construction of said project, for grading and sloping, removal of trees and shrubbery, removal and replacement of fencing, sidewalks and driveways, utility construction work, the storage of materials, the operation of equipment, and the movement of a working force.

The City of Kansas City, Missouri shall cause the surface of lands lying within said Temporary Construction Easements to be restored to substantially the same physical condition that existed at the time the City or its agents entered upon it.

Section 4. That said property interests are hereby authorized condemned and taken for public use and are described as follows:

### Tract No. 2

#### **Pedestrian Right-of-Way:**

A tract of land to be used for public recreational purpose and is part of the Metro Green regional recreational trails/greenway system, through part of Lot 2, EXECUTIVE HILLS NORTH 2ND PLAT, a subdivision of land in the Northwest Quarter of Section 36, Township 52 North, Range 34 West of the 5th Principal Meridian in Kansas City, Platte County, Missouri being bounded and described as follows: Beginning at the Southwest corner of said Lot 2, point also being on the Easterly right-of-way line of Interstate Highway No. 29; thence North 37 degrees 36 minutes 34 seconds west on the Southwesterly line of said Lot 2, 152.56 feet; thence North 29 degrees 28 minutes 46 seconds west on said Southwesterly line, 604.06 feet; thence leaving said Southwesterly line South 54 degrees 38 minutes 52 seconds east, 162.53 feet; thence South 29 degrees 01 minutes 21 seconds east, 225.63 feet; thence South 11 degrees 10 minutes 57 seconds east, 65.28 feet; thence South 29 degrees 00 minutes 52 seconds east, 70.55 feet; thence South 42 degrees 49 minutes 16 seconds east, 95.45 feet; thence South 35 degrees 43 minutes 10 seconds east, 154.25 feet to a point on the Southeasterly line of said Lot 2; thence South 57 degrees 15 minutes 00 seconds west on said Southeasterly line, 63.57 feet to the Point of Beginning.

Containing 42,934 square feet or 0.99 acres, more or less.

Section 5. That just compensation for the property interests taken shall be assessed and paid according to law; and the proceedings to determine compensation shall be prosecuted in one or more suits in the Circuit Court of Platte County, Missouri, pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 523 of the Revised Statutes of Missouri, as supplemented or amended by Section 86.01 to 86.10 of the Rules of Civil Procedure. Payment of compensation shall be made by Kansas City from funds appropriated, or to be appropriated, for such purposes.

Section 6. That pending the acquisition of said lands by condemnation, the Director of the Department of Public Works is hereby authorized to negotiate the purchase of said land and pay for them out of funds appropriated or to be appropriated as aforesaid, and if any tracts be so acquired by negotiation and purchase, the City Attorney is authorized to withdraw same from condemnation proceedings.

Section 7. That said tracts and interests be condemned and conveyed to Kansas City, Missouri.

Section 8. That upon the effective date of this ordinance, the City Clerk is hereby directed to cause this ordinance to be recorded in the office of the Recorder of Deeds for Platte County, Missouri.
