COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR ORDINANCE NO. 220215

Authorizing the City Manager to enter into a Cooperative Agreement with the Kansas City Area Transportation Authority (KCATA) for the funding, design, construction and implementation of certain transportation infrastructure improvements.

WHEREAS, the City and KCATA rank improvement of public transportation as a high priority; and

WHEREAS, City and KCATA have a common interest in development and improvement of transit infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, City and KCATA have determined that it is appropriate to invest in transit infrastructure improvements; and

WHEREAS, the local funding in the amount of \$22.5 million for City-Led Transit and Transportation Infrastructure shall be provided from the Public Mass Transportation Fund; and

WHEREAS, City and KCATA intend to cooperate to assure maximum effectiveness in this joint effort;

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KANSAS CITY:

Section 1. That the City Manager is authorized to enter into a Cooperative Agreement with the KCATA for the funding, design, construction and implementation of certain transportation infrastructure improvements.
