BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KANSAS CITY:

Section 1. That the payment of the sum of \$120,000.00 for the settlement of claims asserted by Sherry Parker in the lawsuit styled *Sherry Parker v. City of Kansas City, Missouri, et al.*, Case No. 2116-CV05122, as recommended by the City Attorney and the Risk Management Committee, is hereby approved.

Section 2. That the City Attorney is hereby authorized to pay the sum of \$120,000.00 in settlement of said claims asserted by Sherry Parker in this lawsuit from funds previously appropriated in Account No. 23-7010-131545-B, Automobile Liability Fund.
