WHEREAS, Kansas City Restaurant Week started thirteen years ago with the purpose of inspiring adventurous and affordable dinning throughout the metropolitan area. This week serves as an opportunity to enjoy great food while also fighting for a good cause; and

WHEREAS, Kansas City Restaurant Week is a 10 day period where restaurants all around the metro join in offering three different types of specials to ensure affordability, of which 10% of sales are donated to a local charity or community partner selected by Kansas City Restaurant Week. Since their start, Kansas City Restaurant Week has raised over \$3.3 million for local charities; and
